Scripture Reading: Amos 7:1-8

Companions, some of you probably heard something familiar in that passage of Scripture. Part of it is used in another Masonic ceremony, often, as I have discovered in my experience, somewhat to the mystification of those present, wondering what it means. The little passage, which was the last section in that reading, is rather out of context in that other ceremony, and that makes its meaning somewhat obscure. This morning, for a few moments, I would like to share some thoughts with you for our own enlightenment.

We have three things in this passage: we have two judgements, and then a final declaration by God. In the judgements, the Lord calls upon a plague of locusts and a storm of fire to wreak havoc among the people in retribution for their sins, for their disobedience. Each of those times, at the behest of Amos the prophet, the Lord changes his mind and says, "This shall not be".

But in the third part, the Lord acts out a sort of parable in the presence of the prophet Amos. Amos saw the Lord standing by a wall built by a plumb line, with a plumb line in his hand. The plumb line is, of course, well known to us in Craft Masonry. As a working tool, it speaks to us of uprightness of life and actions. In this parable from the Book of Amos, the plumb line represents a directive from God about our lives and how we are to lead them. Indeed, it represents many directives from our Divine Creator. It represents his entire revelation of himself to us.

In this Jurisdiction, before any one is made a Mason, he declares that he believes that there is a Supreme Being, that that Supreme Being has revealed himself to mankind, and that that Supreme Being will reward virtue and punish vice. That revelation is represented by the plumb line in this parable from the Book of the Prophet Amos. God is saying, "I have shown you the difference between right and wrong. In the Volume of the Sacred law, in the history of my dealings with my people, there is a guide to your conduct. And it is important!"

Yes, it is important whether we follow or disregard the Grand Creator's revelation of himself. If we follow them, we stay in communion with our Creator. If we disregard them, we may frustrate his will and lose our communion with our Creator. And that means that we become something less than fully human.

As Freemasons, we are challenged to live our lives in accordance with God's revelation of himself to us, for our own benefit as individual human beings, for the benefit of all other human beings upon this planet, and for the honour and glory of God's holy Name.

As we begin this Grand Convocation, my Companions, once again I call upon us all to hear and observe God's words to us, and to carry out that word in our lives and in our actions. So mote it be.

HE ANSWERED THE CALL

Thank you for the honour in allowing me to bring you greetings and the very best wishes of the Grand Lodge of Canada in the Province of Ontario. We wish you much success in the deliberations of these sessions and for the future.

Companions, Masonry in Ontario, is blessed with the inclusion of the members of Grand Chapter as an important part of our fraternal family. All segments of the family have a responsibility to perform their allotted tasks. As a concordant body one of your most important tasks is to convey the expansion of the knowledge of the Craft Degrees. First however, the Craft Lodges must teach those lessons to their members. We in Grand Lodge are developing tools for the use of the Lodge leaders to enable them to meet their responsibilities. The methods for employing these tools are being communicated through the on going "Brother to Brother Program". As this program unfolds throughout the jurisdiction it is our fervent desire that the potential leaders of the future will be better equipped to convey our Masonic teachings to the Brethren.

Presently one of our deepest concerns is the loss of members through resignations and suspensions. Statistics show that annually these losses are out numbering deaths by one and one-half to two times. When studying the reasons for this revolving door syndrome, we are finding there are several challenges that need to be addressed. Some of the prevalent reasons are: The teachings of the Craft are not well communicated; the new members are pushed too fast into offices, resulting in burn out; the Past Masters become bored and loose interest; new members are persuaded to move on through the Concordant Bodies to the Shrine before they have established a firm ownership of the Craft. The challenges, presented by these reasons, can all be addressed by the various members of our fraternal family. The "Brother to Brother Program" addresses the lack of teaching by giving the Lodge leaders a kit of tools to work with. We all must be sensitive to our new member's abilities and not force them past their Masonic maturity. The concordant bodies have an important role to play in rekindling the interests of the Past Master.

My Companions, we all must review and renew our commitments to meet the challenges to our Fraternity. We have the abilities. We have the knowledge. Now we need to activate our desire.

Most Excellent Sir, thank you for your kindness and hospitality, thank you for the opportunity to address your Convocation. I wish for you the best of health and good fortune for you and this Grand Chapter now and in the future.

On Monday, March 8, 1999 we in this Grand Chapter lost another unforgettable Mason in the person of Most Excellent Companion William Simpson Thomson. My thanks to M.Ex.Comp. Charles W Emmett for accepting the responsibility of preparing and presenting The Memoriam to our Past Grand First Principal.

On Monday, March 29, 1999, in Peterborough we were advised of the passing to the Grand Chapter Above of a very dedicated Mason. Right Excellent Companion Lloyd Bertram Gillespie. R.Ex.Comp. Gillespie was in his ninety-ninth year and served this Grand Chapter in a variety of offices. He was also the last Companion appointed to the Honourary Grand Executive - lifetime appointment. R.Ex.Comp. Gillespie shared his wealth of knowledge with his fellow Companions as they became involved in the operations of our Grand Chapter, and that includes this Grand First Principal. He loved his Masonry and for those of us that had the honour to know him, and to work with him we are better men for having had that opportunity. Lloyd Bertram Gillespie - Rest In Peace, you will be missed .

BENEVOLENCE:- Right Excellent Companion Kenneth L Whiting and his Benevolence Committee, continue to apply their expertise to the duties of this most important aspect of Masonry. All Companions are encouraged to notify the Benevolence Committee of a Companion, or a Companion's widow, who may be in need of assistance. Such information will allow us to assist them in their time of need.

CONSTITUTION:- Once again the Presiding Officer of our Grand Chapter has been obliged to deal with breaches of our Constitution. This year there were twenty-eight First Principals who failed to have the Annual Returns of his Chapter submitted to the Grand Chapter office on or before January 31st. This breach of the Constitution results in the Principals and all Past Principals of the delinquent Chapter forfeiting their voting privileges at this Annual Convocation.

It was also my unpleasant duty this year to disqualify Companions from seeking elective office in this Grand Chapter according to Section: BALLOT PAPERS of our Constitution.

PAST RANK:- I have received a request from Prince of Wales Chapter No. 226 of Perth, Ontario to grant Past Rank to Excellent Companion Murray Cameron Kirkpatrick. Excellent Companion Kirkpatrick was Installed and Invested as the First Principal on February 24, 1998 and served his Chapter in that capacity until his death on September 20, 1998.

A request was received from Maple-Granite Chapter No. 61 of Carleton Place, Ontario to grant Past First Principal Rank on Excellent Companion Frederick Alexander McTavish. Excellent Companion McTavish was Installed as Third Principal in January, 1957. Due to unforeseen circumstances Excellent Companion McTavish was unable to advance to the office of Second Principal nor to First Principal. Excellent Companion McTavish is now eighty-five years of age, and over the years he has continued to serve his Chapter with his presence and support.

On March 8, 1999 a request was submitted by Shuniah Chapter No. 82 of Thunder Bay, Ontario to grant Past First Principal Rank on Excellent Companion Clifford Gerald Friday and Excellent Companion James Paul Sanderson. In January, 1998 Excellent Companion Sanderson was Installed as the First Principal of Shuniah Chapter No. 82. He served the Chapter in this capacity until the Amalgamation of Shuniah Chapter No. 82 with Fort William Chapter No. 140.

Due to the negotiated officer line up for the amalgamated Chapters, as well as a pressing business arrangement, Excellent Companion Sanderson did not continue in the Principal's chair. He served as First Principal for a period of nine months and continues to be active in his Chapter. Excellent Companion Clifford Gerald Friday was Installed as First Principal of Fort William Chapter No. 140 in March, 1998. Fort William Chapter No. 140 amalgamated with Shuniah Chapter No. 82 in September, 1998 and Excellent Companion Friday was Proclaimed as First Principal of the newly amalgamated Chapters. In January, 1999 Shuniah Chapter No. 82 held their Installation Ceremony and Excellent Companion Friday was Invested as a Past First Principal. Excellent Companion Friday served the office of First Principal of the two Chapters for a total of ten months.

I am pleased to recommend that the rank of Past First Principal be conferred upon Excellent Companions Frederick Alexander McTavish, Clifford Gerald Friday, James Paul Sanderson and posthumously to the late Excellent Companion Murray Cameron Kirkpatrick.

Never the less I would ask that our Companions maintain their correspondence that it may be shown that the Grand Chapter of Ontario desires to continue this important contact with our sister jurisdictions.

GRAND SUPERINTENDENTS:- The Companions of our seventeen districts annually nominate and elect an Excellent Companion to the office of Grand Superintendent in their respective District. The Companion so nominated and elected must then apply his expertise to oversee the activities and work of the Chapters within his District. He will also be recognized as the representative of the Grand First Principal in carrying out those duties and responsibilities. My congratulations and thanks to those Companions who have served the office of Grand Superintendent during the past year.

To those Grand Chapter officers who are about to complete their term in office, our thanks to you for your interest in being part of this Grand Chapter and I extend my best wishes to each of you in your future endeavours.

DISPENSATIONS:- During the past twelve months there have been 97 dispensations issued, most dealing with matters of a routine nature in the operation of our Chapters. Some of these dispensations were to hold 'Master Mason's Nights' or social events when the Chapter would host their ladies and Lodge brethren. It is always a pleasure for us in Grand Chapter to encourage and support these programs.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON CONSTITUTION, LAWS AND JURISPRUDENCE

To the Most Excellent the Grand First Principal, Officers and Members of The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario:

Most Excellent Sir and Companions:

I am pleased, as Chairman of this Committee, to present its report. The Constitution of Grand Chapter requires this Committee to review and examine all applications by Constituent Chapters to amend Chapter bylaws. Since the last annual Convocation of Grand Chapter, your Committee has received from the Grand Scribe Ezra a number of applications to amend bylaws. These have been examined and returned to the Grand Scribe Ezra with the Committee's recommendation for approval. The bylaws of the following Chapters were amended accordingly: St. John's Chapter No. 6, Hamilton, Grenville Chapter No. 22, Prescott, Warkworth Chapter No. 110, Warkworth, St. Patrick Chapter No. 145, Newmarket, Ionic Chapter No. 168, Campbellford, Temiskaming Chapter No. 169, Haileybury, Hugh Murray Chapter No. 184, Fort Erie, Peel Chapter No. 195, Brampton, Oakwood Chapter No. 233, Pickering, Espanola Chapter No. 257, Espanola, Tecumseh Chapter No. 264, Tottenham.

Application to amend the bylaws of St. John's Chapter No. 3 has been received from the Grand Scribe Ezra and until further material is filed, approval is pending. There are several other applications to amend bylaws currently under review by the Committee which will be transmitted to the Grand Scribe Ezra in due course.

Your Committee was asked to comment (from a legal point of view) on a Resolution of the Investment Committee of Grand Chapter with respect to investment of Grand Chapter funds in mutual funds with particular reference to the Trustee Act of Ontario.

A legal opinion was delivered as requested that mutual funds were not acceptable for Trustee investment at this time, although it is expected that Ontario laws will change in this regard in the future as result of ongoing changes to the Trustee Act of Ontario.

The Companion's attention is again directed to the provisions of Section 79 of the Grand Chapter Constitution. It is here that the requirements for making changes or amendments to Chapter by-laws is spelled out in detail, particularly in Section 79 (d) appearing on Page 63. Your Committee urges all Companions, when consulted about the amendments to Chapter by-laws, that a careful examination of Section 79 (d) be made as the requirements are therein set out in detail. Supplies of the necessary forms may be obtained through the office of the Grand Scribe Ezra.

No Notices of Motion to amend the Constitution have been presented this year and accordingly your Committee makes no comment in that area.

Your Committee would like to go on record as expressing our sincere appreciation to M.Ex.Comp. Harry D Turner and R.Ex.Comp. Melvyn J Duke for their patience and complete cooperation during the past year with the Committee.

The Committee is composed of R.Ex.Comp. John W McGill, V.Ex.Comp. John V Lawer with the undersigned as Chairman. All of which is respectfully submitted on behalf of the Committee. V.Ex.Comp. Norman E Byrne, Chairman.

REPORT OF THE BURSARY COMMITTEE

To the Most Excellent, the Grand First Principal, Officers and Companions of The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario

Most Excellent Sir and Companions:

Another year has passed and how quickly it has come and gone. The Grand Chapter Bursary Committee over the past year had another busy year going over the applications that have been sent to us to consider. Thirty one applications were received from the various Chapters sponsoring children related to our Chapter Companions. Of these applications, twenty eight were accepted and three had to be unfortunately refused.

The applications in some cases are not being filled in properly, which causes long delays in processing the applications. Time should be taken by those who first see these applications to insure that each of the areas are completed by all concerned. We on the committee can not second guess on the answers not being completed. The proper procedure for processing the applications is also an essential part of handling the applications and must go through the Chapter representatives, then to the Grand Superintendents, before being sent to the Bursary Committee.

Applications received this year were from ten first year students, ten second year students, four third year students and four fourth year students.

Three students that were tuned down were all applicants who had already passed through university and college and were seeking post education. Our mandate does not allow for these students to be considered and are therefore not eligible for help, even though they could have used our help. The application clearly states that the application is for students who are entering university or college and that post graduate students are not eligible. These applications should be looked at more carefully by the sponsor and sponsoring Chapter, as well as the Grand Superintendent before being sent to us and then our having to send a letter to the student explaining why we cannot support them.

The twenty eight applicants that did receive a Bursary Award from the Grand Chapter, amounted to \$5700.00 and along with the thousand dollars to the Toronto University Medical School, our total awarded for this year amounted to \$6700.00.

Over half of the Scribe Ezra's of the Chapters are using computers to do their work. There are a number of computer operating systems being used, and this diversity has been a challenge to overcome.

Recently, we have decided to test a document format called Adobe Acrobat PDF. which stands for 'portable document format'. Any Scribe Ezra using a small program called Acrobat Reader, can open these documents regardless of their computer operating system. Acrobat Reader is freely distributed and there is no cost for it's use. We have started a small testing program and if this small program is successful, we will expand it to include more Scribe Ezra's until we feel that it is the correct format for our needs.

REPORT OF THE INVESTMENTS COMMITTEE

To the Most Excellent the Grand First Principal, M.Ex.Comp. Harry D. Turner, Officers and Members of The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

Most Excellent Sir and Companions:

On behalf of The Investment Committee, it is our pleasure to make the following report.

Investment Portfolio details: Your attention is drawn to the audited financial statements as of February 18, 1999 for details on changes to the Medical Research Fund (Release A Miracle Fund), The Scholarship and Bursary Fund and General Fund (General Fund, Commuted Membership Fund and Victory Thanksgiving Benevolence Fund)

Portfolio Management: As Grand Chapter has a number of fixed income securities which mature in the next few years with reasonably high interest rates, the committee has a serious concern about far lower interest rates and the decline in market value of the mutual funds and as a result much reduced interest income in future years. As reported at the November 14, 1998 Grand Executive meeting, the investment Committee, after much discussion, approved the transfer of the management of our investment portfolio from Midland Walwyn (now Merrill Lynch) to Scotia Cassels Investment Counsel Limited.

Meetings: The Investment Committee held four meetings in 1998 during the period from March 1, 1998 to October 21, 1998. R.Ex.Comp. Lloyd Mellor was Chairman up to July 30, 1998 and Ex.Comp. Bev CW Alexander was appointed Chairman on that date by the Grand First Principal.

Appreciations: The Committee would like to express their gratitude to R.Ex.Comp. Melvyn Duke, Grand Scribe Ezra and R.Ex.Comp. John Oldham, Grand Treasurer for all their valued assistance and advice during the past year with respect to our investments portfolio.

REPORT OF THE GRAND TREASURER

To the Most Excellent, the Grand First Principal and Members of The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

Most Excellent Sir and Companions:

INTRODUCTION: It has once again been a busy year for your Grand Treasurer. The vast majority of my time has been spent on activities related to our investments.

During the year we: identified the need for professional financial management, which was approved at our Fall 1998 Grand Executive Meeting; selected a new manager; transferred our investments; and reorganized the portfolio. This has been a very involved, long, drawn out and quite complicated process. The end result is that our investments are now in professional hands, but the short term results are unpalatable as we have had to recognize a loss on our combined portfolios of approximately \$55,000.

However, I do not necessarily believe that this is the end of the matter. I have written to our previous investment advisors, Merrill Lynch, formerly Midland Walwyn, to see what if anything they will do to make good our losses and costs. It is my personal belief that they will go some way to making good these losses.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS: It is my privilege to present to you the financial statements of this Grand Chapter and its two charities for the year ended 28 February, 1999. These statements have been audited by the Hamilton office of Grant Thornton, formerly Doane Raymond, Chartered Accountants. I am pleased to say that we have received a clean audit report with the usual technical qualifications (re the natural inability to confirm the reason ability of the charitable donations received and the uncertainty of year 2000 issue on the organization).

This year the financial statements are presented in accordance with the new reporting requirements of the Canadian Institution of Chartered Accountants. We are continuing the process, started last year, of the two charities each having their own audit reports, with the difference this year that they are paying a nominal amount for the audit

Once again we are indebted to Grant Thornton, and in particular Comp. George F. Benton the managing partner on our audit, for his expert advice provided to the Grand Scribe Ezra and myself during the year.

Our net income is impacted by the following major items:

We are reporting a deficit for the year of approximately \$3000. as against a surplus \$23,000 for the previous year. This difference of \$26,000 is comprised of a reduction in income of approximately \$7000 as a result of lower portfolio yields, and decreased membership.

With the exception of the losses on our investment portfolio of \$19000 expenses were flat year over year.

We do not anticipate any further portfolio losses but declining interest rates and membership indicate that our revenues will be down for the foreseeable future.

SUCCESSOR: During my term as Grand Treasurer, I have made no secret that the role, specifically as it relates to Investment activities, has taken up much more of my time than I anticipated. Too much time in fact, for someone who is still working full time. At the November 1997 meeting of the Executive Committee I provided some suggestions to the future Grand First Principals on the attributes they should consider when considering candidates for the position of Grand Treasurer.

SUMMARY: My time as Grand Treasurer has been eventful. It was not what I expected - I worked on things which I would rather not have, and did not do some things I would have liked. Problems were identified, a lot of difficult decisions were made, decisions which were not always palatable. However I believe that the Grand Chapter's investments are on a sound basis and that any mistakes made in previous years, regarding our investment portfolio and their accounting, have now been rectified.

In concluding I thank M.Ex.Comps. Harry D Turner and R Frank Russell and R.Ex.Comp. Melvyn J Duke for their constant support and understanding.

AUDITOR'S REPORT

We have audited the statement of operations of The Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario as at February 28, 1999 and the statements of operations and changes in the net assets and cash flows for the year then ended. These financial statements are the responsibility of the organization's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform an audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation.

The accompanying financial statements do not draw attention to the uncertainty caused by the Year 2000 Issue that arises because it is not certain that all aspects of this issue affecting the organization and those related to efforts of suppliers or other third parties, will be fully resolved.

In our opinion, except for the omission of the disclosure described in the preceding paragraph, these financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the organization as at February 28, 1999 and the results of its operations and the changes in cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.

Notes to the Financial Statements

1 Nature of Operations: The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario is a not for profit organization which serves as the central administrative body for Masonic Chapters in the Province of Ontario. The organization is exempt from income tax under the income tax act.

2 Summary of significant accounting policies

Inventories: Inventories of supplies for sale and for use are valued at cost.

Fixed Assets: Fixed assets are stated at acquisition cost. New additions are not depreciated in accordance with generally accepted accounting principals but are charged to expenditure in the year of acquisition. The cost of additions is then added to the accumulated cost of fixed assets in the records and to accumulated depreciation.

Revenue recognition: The organization follows the deferral method of accounting contributions whereby restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expenses are incurred. Revenue from operations is recognized at the time goods are shipped or services are supplied to members.

Income from investments: Dividends are recorded as revenue when received. Interest on investments is recognized as income when it becomes due. Premiums or discounts on investments are expended or recognized as income, when incurred.

4 Financial instruments: The financial instruments of the organization include cash, receivables, payables and portfolio investments. The fair market values of cash, receivables and payables are assumed to approximate their carrying amounts because of their short term maturity. The fair values of investments are assumed to approximate quoted values. Market value of the investment portfolio is \$346,729 (1998 - \$373,330).

Included in investments are share in York Masonic Temple Limited, received as part of the dissolution of a particular chapter. These shares are recorded in the books at a nominal value of \$1 per share. Portfolio investments are placed in well capitalized, high quality corporate and government securities. The organization does not use derivative instruments to reduce its exposure to interest and foreign currency risk. The organization has not significant concentrations of credit risk.

5 Restricted net assets: The net assets restricted for Commuted Membership represents funds that have accumulated with respect to lifetime membership payments. Some chapter members have made lump sum payments to satisfy future membership obligations. These net assets are subject o internally imposed restrictions stipulating that the resources be maintained to provide annualized returns intended to compensate the organization for the costs of servicing these members.

The net assets restricted for Victory Thanksgiving Benevolence are internally restricted for purposes of providing welfare assistance to companions and their families in need. These amounts are not available for other purposes without the approval of the membership.

6 Related entities: The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario (The Grand Chapter) exercises significant influence over both the Grand Chapter - Scholarship and Bursary Fund and The Grand Chapter - Medical Research Fund. The Grand Chapter annually appoints the board of directors for both organizations. Both related entities are registered charities under the income tax act.

The Scholarship and Bursary Fund was established to provide assistance to Royal Arch Masons, dependants of members, widows and orphans of members to complete their education at universities, community or technical colleges. The Medical Research Fund was established to provide funds for medical research upon receiving a valid request for assistance.

Neither the Scholarship and Bursary Fund nor the Medical Research Fund have been consolidated in the Grand Chapter financial statements. Financial summaries of these unconsolidated entities as at February 28, 1999 and 1998 and for the years then ended are as follows:

REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

To the Most Excellent, the Grand First Principal and Members of The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

Most Excellent Sir and Companions:

Your Finance Committee has reviewed the monthly Financial Statements of the Grand Treasurer, monitoring the progress in comparison to the Budget Estimates approved by Grand Chapter last April. I thank the Grand Scribe Ezra for his untiring diligence and the Grand Treasurer for his assistance in providing the information required. The February, year end Financial Statement has been reviewed in detail. And, subsequently the Financial Statements prepared by our Auditor, Comp. George Benton of Grant Thornton. We are satisfied that they present the financial operations of our Grand Chapter during the last fiscal year.

As has been reported, the reductions in our Investment Portfolio and consequent reductions in Interest Income have a major impact on the 1999-2000 Budget. Last year Grand Chapter's expenses exceeded revenues by over \$11,000. The impact of the Loss on Sale of investments would have been greater had not the 1998 Convocation Committee's expenses come in \$2200. under budget. The Committee thanks them for their excellent result. We hope this year's Committee produces a similar result. We are budgeting Revenue for this year of \$91,432. and Expenses of \$92,925. A budgeted deficit of \$1493. Your Committee, managed this by reducing the Transfer to the Commuted Fund by \$8000., the Office Equipment Purchase Allowance by \$1000. and tightening the line wherever else possible. We are confident that the expenditures are appropriate and the receipts, while showing a deficit, are conservatively reliable.

In consequence of the foregoing, The Finance Committee will bring forth a Notice of Motion to increase the Annual Per/Capita by \$1.00 effective on approval by this Grand Chapter next April. The constituent Chapters need to examine their budgets and Dues structure and take appropriate action in 1999 to be prepared for this necessary increase in 2000.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE MEDICAL RESEARCH FUND RELEASE A MIRACLE

To the Most Excellent, the Grand First Principal, Officers and Members of The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

Most Excellent Sir and Companions:

You are all probably aware from articles in the news media of the cuts that have been imposed both federally and provincially upon moneys available for research. The hospital for Sick Children has taken full page advertisements to highlight both their work and plea for donations. This plight is not theirs alone and affects all research labs across the country. We in Ontario are privileged to have some of the finest facilities in the country thus our work as philanthropists becomes even more important. Research takes time and we have been supporting certain labs, Dr. Poznanski Royal Victoria Hospital London for example, for some time. You may have read reports that the battle against cancer has opened a new and exciting front that is now entering the stage of clinical trials. This means the therapy is being tested against strict scientific criteria, in selected patients, in order to prove its efficacy. The new front is one we have reported on before, the prevention of blood vessel growth within a developing tumour. Without a blood supply the tumour cannot develop let alone spread. We as an organization can take great pride in being an active participant in the development of this therapy which may especially benefit those with cancer of the breast. Latest word is that clinical trials are not far away.

Dr. Gallie continues to develop world wide criteria for the treatment of retinoblastomas out of Sick Kids Hospital. This is being conducted over the Internet. I feel that this the way of the future in research allowing the collation data to be rapidly assimilated. An the results transmitted to interested parties.

Prof. Yendt, calcium metabolism, is preparing statical evidence for an increase in the recognised dose of this mineral in the preservation of bon mass as we age. These results are now part of the recommended Canadian Food Guide 1500 - 2000 mg. calcium per day instead of 500 mg. You may have noticed the milk marketing board was quick to jump on the band wagon now stating 6-8 glasses of milk is what you need. Most of us will also need a new bladder!

The Novos trial is in its early stages and will make a few years to determine the clinical efficacy of using this putty in the repair of broken bones. This trial is in its infancy and meaningful numbers have yet to be generated.

REPORT OF THE PUBLIC RELATIONS COMMITTEE

To the Most Excellent, the Grand First Principal, Officers and members of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario

Most Excellent Sir and Companions:

I would like to begin by expressing my personal word of appreciation to you, Most Excellent Sir, for having the confidence to appoint me a year ago as the Chair of this very important committee. I was humbled by the honour and the responsibility for I wasn't sure that I could follow in the footsteps of some of my very distinguished and able predecessors, including R.Ex.Comp. Edward J Ounjian and R.Ex.Comp M Sheldon Boomhour. Assured however that I would be supported by an expanded committee representative of the whole of our Grand Jurisdiction, I accepted the challenge. After contacting each member of the committee as appointed, I soon learned that I was not alone; a more talented and committed group of masons one seldom finds; I am deeply indebted to all of them.

My first act as Chairman was to organize the nineteen members into five regional groups, namely the Western Region (Southwestern Ontario - roughly District 1,2,3,4 and 6), the Central Region (Toronto, Hamilton, and Niagara - roughly Districts 5,7,8,9 and 10), the Eastern Region (eastern Ontario - roughly Districts 11,12 and 13), the Northern Region (northern Ontario - roughly districts 15 and 16) and the Northwestern Region (northwestern Ontario - District 14). I appreciate the willingness of five members of the committee to serve as regional coordinators or contacts, namely V.Ex.Comp. Shayne Eldridge (western), R.Ex.Comp. Eugene de Beaupre (central), R.Ex.Comp. Roland Paddle (eastern), R.Ex.Comp. Norman McComb (northern) and R.Ex.Comp. Alan Tibbetts (northwestern). Throughout the year these regional coordinators, assisted by many of their subcommittee members, worked diligently and effectively, making contacts throughout their region, accepting invitations for events of various kinds, and accompanying the Grand First Principal and the Grand Superintendents on their many visits. Because of this new structure, we were enabled to work, often simultaneously, in the various areas of the province. None of us had to travel long distances, thus saving time, expense and excessive fatigue.

Most of you are now quite familiar with the large, ten panel public relations display, a most effective communication tool. This large display was retained for several major events over the summer and early fall. Thereafter, in order to provide the regions with their own smaller, portable display, I created four, three panel, table top displays, each with its own "Royal Arch Masons" header sign, a core group of pictures (the Grand Council), and a carrying case. I then personally delivered these to three of the regional coordinators (western, central and eastern), who then personalized them with their own material, enabling them to take their displays to events in their regions. The fourth display I retained for myself for my own visits and events in the Ottawa area and beyond.

Though the western region display was taken to the Windsor/Chatham area, there has been a request for another such unit for that area. In this project I am deeply indebted to the Grand Chapter office for purchasing several new panels, to R.Ex.Comp. Ted Burns for producing the four new "header" signs, and to an Ottawa friend, Pauline Barnes, for donating the material and constructing two more carrying cases. I have called for the return all of the smaller units for the reassembling of the large display for this Grand Chapter Convocation, with the creative input of each of the coordinators.

The committee members have been quite active over the past year, particularly during the summer and fall, attending meetings and events across the jurisdiction. In nearly all of the following, our displays, large or small, were prominently shown. A summary of the events include: Grand Lodge, Toronto (July 14-16, 1998); visit of the Grand First Principal, his Council and other Grand Chapter Officers (two from our committee), to the northwestern and northern regions (District 14, 15 and 16) to attend particularly the amalgamation of Shuniah Chapter No. 82 with Fort William Chapter No. 140 (September 1-5, 1998); the Western Fair, London, in cooperation with a regional Grand Lodge group (September 11-20, 1998); the International Ploughing Match, Sunbury (September 15-19, 1998); the visit of the Grand Council to Ottawa District 13 (three Chapters and a Reception for the Grand First Principal) October 5-8, 1998); visits of the Grand Superintendent of Ottawa District 13 (six Chapters, October-November, 1998); presentation at The St. Patrick Chapter No. 145 (October, 1998); the amalgamation of Harris Chapter No. 41, Ingersoll with Oxford Chapter No. 18, Woodstock, at Ingersoll (October 27, 1998); Masonic Open House during Masonic Awareness Week, Cornwall (November 1, 1998)' a fraternal visit of Ancient Frontenac & Cataraqui Chapter No. 1, Kingston, to Mount Sinai Chapter No. 44, Napanee (November 18, 1998); a dinner and program, Grenville Chapter No. 22, Prescott November 21, 1998); an Open House, Manitou Chapter No. 27, Collingwood (November 25, 1998); St. John's Chapter No. 3, London (November 24, 1998); an Open House, sponsored by Ottawa area Shriners, Ottawa (November 28, 1998); a Master Masons Night, Maitland Chapter No. 68, Kemptville December 10, 1998); the dedication of new Chapter room, Chatham (Dec. 23, 1998); a Craft Degree Team, made up entirely of Royal Arch Masons (Third Degree), Golden Lodge, Windsor (January 15, 1999); and a Royal Arch Degree Team of Past Grand Chapter Officers, Windsor Chapter No. 71, Windsor (12 candidates) (February 8, 1999). Members of our committee attended all of the above events, showing that we were active in ALL districts of the jurisdiction in a single year -- a great achievement!

I cannot conclude before I pay tribute to an adjunct member of our committee, namely R.Ex.Comp. Bruce Miller, the Editor of the Keystone. I am sure that you will all join me in congratulating him on the publication of two excellent editions of our Grand Chapter newsletter. Well done, good and faithful servant! But please remember, my Companions, that Bruce needs your help; send him articles and pictures, news of the activities in your District; only with your help can we continue to have such a good public relations communicating tool.

Wherever you go on your journeys both masonic and non-masonic, never fail to tell of and live your masonic ideals, particularly learned through Royal Arch Masonry! Your efforts at public relations will undoubtedly yield both new members and keep those who have lost interest over the years. And let us ENJOY ourselves.

Finally, I extend thanks to each member of my committee for their efforts, your wives who have often accompanied you along the many roads, the Grand Council and our Grand Scribe Ezra. Thank you for your friendships, encouragement and advice.

FUTURE CONVOCATIONS AD HOC COMMITTEE

To the Most Excellent, the Grand First Principal, Officers and Members of The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

Most Excellent Sir and Companions:

I would preface my remarks by stating that I accepted the dubious honour of chairing this committee on the proposed restructuring of this Annual Convocation. The remarks I am making are ideas that have been explored by the committee.

These have been put in the form of a questionnaire which is available to you and which you picked up when you registered and from the remarks that we receive from that questionnaire will in great measure determine what the final report of this committee will be.

Your committee met on Friday, February 26th at the office of the Sovereign Great Priory in Toronto and we reviewed in detail the report submitted by the previous committee and examined all the details contained therein and went on to examine more methods in which we feel would be a benefit to this Grand Chapter in the future. The proposal that we are attempting to attain would be to meet at Grand Chapter for the instruction of the Grand Superintendents and the Secretaries on Friday morning, Friday afternoon Grand Chapter would open in business form and receive the reports and the notices of motion and conduct most of the business of Grand Chapter, Friday evening would be a social time.

Saturday morning would see the formal opening of this Grand Chapter, receive the guests, conduct the Memorial Service, receive the Grand First Principals address and similarly present the Friday morning program. Saturday afternoon we would continue the business with the greeting from the visitors and the ceremony of installation and closing which would be followed in the evening with the Grand Chapter banquet.

At the time of registering you would vote as you register and you would register until 10 a.m. Saturday morning when the registrations would close and the ballots would be tabulated and be reported on before the recess of Grand Chapter Saturday at noon. An other concept was that the Grand Scribe Ezra would pursue the cost of issuing the preliminary reports which would be distributed at the time of registration, you would be able to visually see the reports that were going to be presented, and in this way the reports instead of being given in detail could be summarized and perhaps reduce the time of the business session of Grand Chapter.

Much discussion as to the location versus the attendance and the cost associated with the holding of this annual convocation. We noted that border cities such as Windsor and Niagara Falls and possibly even Ottawa are expensive and attractive to the general public and due to the casinos and are not suitable candidates for our needs. The downtown Toronto area is very expensive yet attractive for the ladies. The airport strip is expensive and remote for ladies and other member activities. Reports from other centres such as Sudbury and Peterborough as they do not have the facilities or capacity to meet our needs.

The Convocation in Kingston was considered to be very economically run and the hotel accommodation was excellent, the costs were within reason to all the delegates who attend this Grand Chapter more than that, they were generous in giving rooms out complimentary hence it was very economical as far as Grand Chapter was concerned and the facilities that are available to us in Kitchener where we are going next year for our Grand Convocation there are reputed to be excellent, with ample parking the rates are very favourable.

We expect that Kitchener will be a wonderful place to hold future Grand Convocations. It is our thinking to avoid some of the more expensive places that the best way would be an East/West alternate location in future years, perhaps one meeting in Kingston one year and Kitchener the next year and if some other locations generally in the east and west had the comparable facilities and a reasonably price they could also be considered.

The other item that we discussed, should the Grand Superintendents serve for a two year term to coincide with the election of the Grand First and the Grand Council for a two year term and the rest of the elected officers would of course be elected annually as they are at the present time. The Grand Executive Committee would be on the same timing with appointments.

As I pointed out, there is a survey there, and this is an interim report which is given and we trust that when we receive the reports that you submit to us this committee will review in detail the results. It is expected that we will present our report at the next Executive meeting and the next meeting of this Grand Chapter.
