

Reading of Scripture: Daniel 12: 1-3

Homily: A New Name: One of the basic tenets of Freemasonry is the belief that God will reward good and punish vice. Indeed, throughout the various degrees we are taught that the hope of mankind is life after death. Just how this life after death will be realized is only God's to reveal, and that revelation will come to each of us at that time when we will have been summoned from this sublunary abode to be with our Creator.

The passage of scripture we just heard, taken from Daniel 12:1-3 is one of the first breakthroughs in religious thought concerning God's plan for our eternal reward for a life well spent. In fact, along with the passage from Isaiah 24-27, it is the first scriptural references indicating a substantial belief in life after death as to be realized in terms of resurrection. These two scriptural passages are the proofs of faith that there lies beyond this mortal life and the prospects of a cold tomb, a sure and certain resurrection to a life eternal in God's kingdom.

This eternal life in God's kingdom is assured but will only come at the last day and only then after much tribulation.

When we do return to our Creator it will be as spiritual beings with spiritual bodies and at that time we will receive a new name suited to the new relationship we will experience with one another and with our Heavenly Father.

The new name will be found in the Book sealed until the last day. Those new names will no longer point out our earthly identities. There will no longer be a John Doe or a Tom Smith or a David Paul Hardie but rather a name pointing out our relationship as brothers and sons of the one true God.

So it is that while we live here in this earthly state we remember the names of our companions who have laid down their working tools and no longer dwell among us. We cherish their memories in our hearts but we look forward to being reunited with them as brothers with new identities and new names as sealed in the Book and to be opened on the last day. Amen

It is a pleasure to bring you and the Companions here assembled fraternal greetings on behalf of all the brethren of The Grand Lodge A.F. & A.M. of Canada in the Province of Ontario. We are delighted to be with you in the beautiful Masonic Limestone Quarries of Kingston and trust your efforts of hewing the stones will produce building blocks honourable to the builder and keystones of progress for the future. Thank you Most Excellent Sir for the courtesies and hospitality extended to your Grand Master and My First Lady Marjorie, they are very much appreciated.

I am delighted to see that M.Ex.Comp. Harry Turner is with us this morning. As many of you know Harry was in the hospital lately. His young doctor was quite concerned and was trying to impress upon Harry the seriousness of his illness "There is no point in hiding it from you Mr. Turner, the fact is that you are a very, very, very sick man. Do you have any last requests?" "Yes!" grumbled Harry "Get me another doctor!".

We are all familiar with the Legend of Hiram and how there was confusion in King Solomon's Temple when all of a sudden there were no plans or designs for the workmen.

Things had changed and for a time, chaos reigned supreme. Everyone looked to the other workmen to bring direction to the building of the Temple. The system had changed. Many said they were doomed without the Master Builder. Many threw up their hands in despondency, some couldn't cope and just quit. But there were others that grasped the new conditions and took a new leadership role for Scripture informs us that the Temple was indeed completed and dedicated.

Companions, have you ever considered that today we face a similar situation. The design is changed. Following the old plans will not build the Temple of the future. I refer of course to the manner in which new members may enter the Shrine. Last year at this time an edict was in place that would not permit Ontario Masons to join the Shrine without the prerequisites of being a member of the Preceptory or a 32 Degree Scottish Rite Mason. The design had to be the same ie. same rules for all Ontario Masons and this was not the case. On July 8th, a new plan equal for all was passed in Boston at the Imperial Session and so the edict that dealt with the inequality no longer was applicable. Regardless of whether you feel good, bad, or indifferent about the decision to remove the prerequisites the fact is, it is a reality and the old system is changed. It is a new game - the rules have changed. Same old, same old won't work anymore; and yes there is confusion in the Temple.

No longer can we as Companions let others be our sales force. No longer are we only competing with the other Rite for Members. Within the Craft the two lane road has changed to a multilane expressway with a multitude of cloverleafs. New plans and designs must be quickly adopted showing the benefits of taking this road to more light. As Companions we must seek new careers in Masonic sales and service. The product has the same intrinsic value but the packaging must be new and improved. Don't get me wrong, I am not advocating changing the ritual and I assure you I am definitely opposed to reading any Ritual. What I am saying is that a concerted effort is required to provide top notch, first class degrees. A concerted effort has to be made by each of us to live the lessons and follow the teachings of our Chapter and Craft Lodge. Ownership by all, not just a devoted few is necessary to build a better Arch; one that may be justifiably called "Royal" in every sense of the word, and you! you and you are the Keystones.

Companions if you believe in your Chapter, if you believe in Freemasonry then the time is now! It is time to pick up the new plans, time to apply your working tools and develop new skills, and together enter the Quarry to build an Edifice For The Future.

GRAND FIRST PRINCIPAL'S ADDRESS

To the Most Excellent Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada, in the Province of Ontario, Past Grand First Principals, Grand Chapter Officers, Distinguished Guests and Companions. It is a privilege to receive and greet the representatives of the concordant bodies and visitors from our sister provinces and from the United States of America.

I also wish to acknowledge in our midst – "Companion and Most Worshipful Brother Robert J McKibbon," Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Canada, in the Province of Ontario. Most Worshipful Sir, may I extend to you on behalf of this Grand Convocation a most sincere and warm welcome and assure you that this Grand Chapter pledges its loyalty and allegiance to you. Your outstanding contributions, devoted leadership, and mutual understanding during your term of office is much appreciated by this Grand Chapter. As your term of office is nearing its end may I on behalf of this Grand Convocation wish for you good health and happiness, and may you continue to serve our Grand Lodge in the years to come.

Companions we are again meeting here in Kingston, a city with a population of 71,000 people. Kingston is situated near the entrance of the St. Lawrence River and was the Capital of Canada from 1841 to 1844. Many of the old limestone buildings are still standing throughout the city. Fort Henry, a majestic landmark overlooking the St. Lawrence River stands as a symbol of strength and relates to the early years of wars on Canadian soil.

To the Companions serving on this Convocations Committee under the chairmanship of R.Ex.Comp. Rolland Paddle, I thank you all for your participation and all you have done to make this convocation successful. One year ago, I was installed to the high and important office of Grand First Principal of this Grand Chapter.

As Grand First Principal one must recognize the importance of setting an example of excellence in one's life and realize that the future of this Fraternity rests on our shoulders.

We as companions of this great fraternity of Royal Arch Masons must prepare ourselves for entry into this new century of changing times and new challenges. Should we change with the times — Set new goals and methods of operations, in order to maintain a position in the changing times. My answer to these questions is Royal Arch Masonry lies in the hands of our present membership. They will make of it what they desire (they are you and I, Companions.)

Let us never be afraid to question Royal Arch Masonry in relation to changing conditions. But along with all this, the voices of experience should not go unheeded.

The voices of experience lay in the hands of our Past Grand First Principals. We must recognize fully the great contributions in time, in energy, and the many honours they have brought to Royal Arch Masonry during their terms in office over the last many years. I will not attempt at this time to describe the sterling qualities they all possess as it would infringe on the time allotted for this convocation. I thank you all Most Excellent Sirs for being here today and would ask you to continue your interest in Royal Arch Masonry.

At this time, I would like to thank the many Companions and Chapters who expressed their concern during my hospital stay in the months of January and February with phone calls and get well cards. I thank you all for your concern.

To Most Excellent Companion Leslie Levitt who ably represented your Grand First Principal at two installations and two amalgamations in the month of February and March. I thank you Most Excellent Sir for representing me on those occasions.

NECROLOGY: As in other years, we in our Chapters mourn the passing of so many Companions who have gone from our Chapters and moved through that celestial gates from which no traveller returns. Let us remember them as good men and may we thank God for such men. They have left with us a noble heritage of blessed memories. We and the world are richer for having them live amongst us. Our Grand Chaplain R.Ex.Comp. David Hardie during the morning will give us a full and complete report on the Fraternal Dead and a Memorial Service to their memory.

BENEVOLENCE: Benevolence is a word which implies that none of us prospers but by the Grace of God and there is a duty to see that those who are in need are provided for. It is also a kind word, the friendly greeting, it is the sympathetic understanding of a Companion or widow's shortcomings, and joy in their welfare. It is not for me to dwell on the work being done by R.Ex.Comp. Edward Ounjian, Chairman of the Benevolent Committee and his Committee Members on the quiet and compassionate manner in which they carry out their duties and commitments to the Benevolence Committee and to our Grand Chapter. May your Committee continue their good work on behalf of Royal Arch Benevolence.

CONSTITUTION: During my first year as Grand First Principal my main concern is with 52 Chapters who failed to send in their Annual Returns on time and were denied voting privileges. Returns according to Section 20 G (Annual Returns) must be sent in on or before the closing of business on January 31. The Grand First Principal on being advised by the Grand Scribe Ezra that the returns and payments of a Chapter having been received prior to the First day of March may lift such denial after due and serious consideration. Such demands have been lifted on 40 chapters. However 12 who did not send in returns prior to March 1st are deprived of voting privileges and are prohibited from having a member stand for or holding a Grand Chapter office or for consideration to receive a Grand Chapter appointment. It was also necessary by your Grand First Principal to disqualify three Companions seeking elective office in our Grand Chapter. These disqualifications were the results of aspirants names being published in Chapter summon's and by other means of communication.

PAST RANK: I have received a request from Peel Chapter No. 195, Brampton to grant Past Rank on Excellent Companion Fred Highmore. Excellent Companion Highmore was installed as Second Principal on January 8th, 2000. He was forced to leave his place of employment and the office of Second Principal due to a serious heart condition. I am pleased to recommend that the Rank of Past First Principal be conferred upon Excellent Companion Fred Highmore.

GRAND SUPERINTENDENTS: The Grand Superintendents over the past year have represented the Grand First Principal with dignity and propriety. They have served their districts well and rendered a distinct and much appreciated service to Royal Arch Masonry. Although their term in office was twelve months in duration, in those twelve months they completed their allotted tasks to the satisfaction of your Grand First Principal and this Grand Chapter. I would like to thank the Grand Superintendents who supported the Grand First Principal at many official functions.

DISPENSATION: During the past twelve months there has been 76 dispensations issued. The majority being for changes of dates and times of meetings and several for Ladies Nights.

PRESENTATION OF JEWELS AND CERTIFICATES: Over the past year many of our veteran members have been presented with Bars and Jewels in recognition of long service: 25 year Past Principal Bars 11 50 year Past Principal Bars 2 50 year Royal Arch Jewel 29 60 year Pin 1 Past Principal Certificates 22

ANNIVERSARIES: On September 14th, 2000 a 50 year celebration was held by Tillsonburg Chapter No 255, Wilson District No. 3.This one day event was well attended by the Companions and Ladies of Tillsonburg Chapter as well as Companions from other Chapters in the surrounding districts.

APPOINTMENTS: In keeping with our Constitution, Section 50 Subsection (c) for dedicated service rendered to our Grand Chapter, I recommend the confirming of Honourary Membership in the Grand Executive on V.Ex.Comp. Norman E. Byrne. V.Ex.Comp. Norman E Byrne who over the last many years has been active in Grand Chapter. As Chairman of the Committee on Constitution, Laws and Jurisprudence, he has contributed his expertise on matters of importance and Grand Chapter has gained much. His sterling character, great ability, and high integrity is my assurance that he deserves this Honourable Rank.

AMALGAMATIONS: On Wednesday, September 27, 2000 a large turnout of Past and Present Grand Chapter Officers and Companions attended the amalgamation in London of St. John's Chapter No. 3 and St. Georges Chapter No. 5.

On Thursday, January 25, 2001 in the City of Cambridge we saw the amalgamation of Preston Chapter No. 245 and Waterloo Chapter No. 32. And again on Thursday, March 8, 2001 in the City of Hamilton we saw the amalgamation of St. John's Chapter No. 6 and McKay Chapter No. 243. A large turnout of Past and Present Grand Chapter Officers and Companions were in attendance. Grand Chapter closely investigated these applications for amalgamation and felt it was a necessary step for these Chapters to take in order to guarantee their survival in the years to come.

PUBLIC RELATIONS AND KEYSTONE: The Public Relations Committee members have given our Grand Chapter many hours of their time visiting Chapter events, Ontario Ploughing Match, Grand Lodge, Royal and Select Masters and Shrine Ceremonials. As the new year is now upon us, our Public Relations Committee will be looking for volunteers to assist with this project.

Over the last year I discontinued the publication of the "Keystone." It was felt that in many cases, the events mentioned had already taken place and were considered to be "old news", by mailing time. We replaced the "Keystone" in favour of a page in the "Ontario Mason" published by Grand Lodge. Some 60,000 Master Masons are receiving our message, "Curious about the Holy Royal Arch?" through this publication. Master Masons are asking questions and in many cases requesting Chapter applications.

VISITATIONS: During the past year I have visited Chapters throughout our Grand Jurisdiction, probably not as many as the Past Principal living in our southern Districts, who are a few miles from many Chapters. Distance and weather conditions are the draw back of living so far north. I was forced to cancel my visits during the last half of the month of January and all of February due to health reasons (my surgery and hospital stay).

My Itinerary to date will be printed in the 2001 Proceedings and will only include my visits to Chapters and Chapter events.

During the year I had the opportunity to represent our Grand Chapter at the following Convocations outside our Jurisdiction:

SPECIAL RECEPTIONS: During the Past year, I was received and honoured at three receptions. I will long remember these special nights and thank the Companions of the individuals districts for their kind and considerate efforts:

October 14, 2000 October 19, 2000 November 4, 2000 London District No. 3, Tillsonburg New Ontario District No. 15, Sudbury Ontario District No. 10, Midland

INTERNET: Since our last convocation, we have become involved with a Royal Arch Web site available to "cyber surfing" Masons and the world at large. This project is being put together by members of the various Chapters under the direction of our Grand Second Principal, R.Ex.Comp. Sheldon Boomhour.

Some of our members may oppose this move by Grand Chapter while others, may favour the use of computers and the Internet by Grand Chapter. With the availability of this new technology, it affords our Grand Body a wonderful opportunity to communicate with all masonic bodies and the non-masonic communities at large.

CONCLUSION: It has been my pleasure over the last twelve months to visit many Chapters in many Districts. I thank the Companions of these Chapters for the cordial manner in which I was received. To the Companions and Superintendents who attended these meetings, your presence was much appreciated.

To our Committee Chairmen and their respective committee members, I congratulate you all collectively for your presence here today and for your reports describing your accomplishments over the past year. To our Past Grand First Principals, I thank you for your assistance over the last twelve months and may I wish for you all many years of good health.

From the many Chapter summons I receive, I am pleased to report that many of our Chapters are reporting an increase in Candidates while others are experiencing difficult times and looking to amalgamation for survival.

As our Grand Convocation drew near I had much concern pertaining to Grand Chapter appointments. During my visits, over the last twelve months, I have asked the Scribes to send to the Grand Chapter Office for consideration by your First Principal, the names of worthy Companions who the Chapter felt should be given an appointment. Very few names have been submitted. It must be realized that your Grand First Principal does not know who these Companions might be and results in worthy Companions not receiving the appointed honour they deserve.

To R.Ex.Comp. Sheldon Boomhour, Grand Second Principal and R.Ex.Comp. Richard Jackson, Grand Third Principal, I thank you for your support over the last twelve months and for your dedication to our Grand Chapter.

To our Grand Scribe Ezra, R.Ex.Comp. Melvyn J Duke, your knowledge of your duties and details of the work entrusted to you in the interest of Royal Arch Masonry and this Grand Chapter has given your Grand First Principal the benefits of your assistance on all matters of importance. REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON CONSTITUTION, LAWS AND JURISPRUDENCE

To the Most Excellent the Grand First Principal, Officers and Members of The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario:

Most Excellent Sir and Companions:

I am pleased as Chairman of this committee to present the report of this committee for the year 2000/2001 covering administration under its mandate over the above period, together with other matters with which the committee dealt as required by the Constitution of Grand Chapter under Article 59.

In the last Masonic year your committee has considered applications from twenty six chapters to amend their respective bylaws. After close examination of the material received from the Grand Scribe Ezra your committee approved twenty four of the applications, returned one for correction and re-submission, and reviewed one set of proposed bylaws presented for preapproval and comments, which, with a slight amendment were returned with your committees approval and comments.

Your committee has considered and reviewed several notices of motion to amend the Constitution, and as required by the committee's mandate, reports on them now.

Your committee has reviewed the material containing the various amendments that were received from the Grand Scribe Ezra and without restating word for word, all of the amendments, which are quite extensive, your committee has referred to them in this report by naming the companion who proposed them. Full copies of the several notices of motion are available through the office of the Grand Scribe Ezra.

- 1. M.Ex.Comp. Harry Turner has proposed an amendment to Article 55(h) in effect to remove the "Long Range Planning Committee" as a Standing Committee of the Grand Executive Committee. Your Committee finds the proposed amendment regular and in order.
- 2. R.Ex.Comp. Walter T Bulbeck proposes an amendment to Section 72 which defines the responsibilities of the "Long Range Planning Committee". As there is already an amendment dealing with the status of this Committee before Grand Chapter, it is premature to consider this amendment to rename and redefine a new Committee's responsibilities and, accordingly, your Committee finds this amendment not to be regular and in order.

Comp. Bulbeck proposes to amend Article 56(a) and 56(c), (incorrectly lettered (b)) by adding the word "Grand" before Treasurer in 56(a) and in 56(c) deleting "that the expenditures... . to cover them" and to replace it with "the financial viability of Grand Chapter". Your Committee finds this proposed amendment regular and in order.

The third amendment of Comp. Bulbeck is to delete Article 54(b), (f) and (g) and insert them in Article 55 as (j) Constitution Review, (k) Archives and (I) History. Your Committee finds this amendment to be regular and in order.

The fourth amendment of Comp. Bulbeck is an amendment to Article 29(k) (incorrectly stated in the proposed amendment as Article 28(k) deleting the word "principals" and "excellent principals" with the word "councils". The word "councils" is nowhere defined in the Constitution of Grand Chapter and therefore, due to lack of definition and uncertainty, your Committee finds this proposed amendment not to be regular or in order.

3. The first amendment by M.Ex.Comp. Bob Jackson proposes "remuneration" to the Principals in specified amounts respectively. Traditionally, elected senior officers of Grand Chapter have never been paid for their services, or otherwise remunerated. Accordingly, your Committee finds this proposed amendment not to be regular or in order, as it flies in the face of Royal Arch traditions of many, many years. Your Committee suggests that this matter more properly should be a budgetary matter of a committee and dealt with accordingly.

In the second part of Comp. Jackson's amendments, he uses the expression "an elected member of Grand Executive Committee", Article 50(c) has two kinds of "elected persons". Those described in the first seven lines of that section e.g. the Grand First Principal etc. and those described in the last three lines of the Article, namely five members of the Grand Executive Committee to be elected annually for a two-year term, it is uncertain, and otherwise unknown to your Committee, whether the proposed amendment refers to the first group or the second group above indicated, as both are "elected members of the Grand Executive Committee". Accordingly, for uncertainty and lack of definition, your Committee finds this proposed amendment not regular or otherwise in order.

4. The amendments to the Constitution proposed by Comp. Gordon Cross to Articles 109 and 110 have been examined by your Committee, and your Committee finds the proposed amendment to Article 109, dealing with amalgamation of Chapters, is contrary to the basic legal principles that a body or entity must be first formed in its basic form and then it has the capacity to regulate its conduct and affairs by creating By-laws accordingly and, therefore, your Committee finds this proposed amendment not to be regular or in order.

The proposed amendment to Article 110 provides for an "adjudicator" (proposed amendment 110(c)) to make decisions for the Grand First Principal. When a Companion is elected to this office of leadership by the Companions of Royal Arch, he does not have the right to delegate that power to someone else, as he himself, (the Grand First Principal) is, in effect, delegated by the Royal Arch Companions to carry out the administration and management of Grand Chapter. Accordingly, your committee finds this proposed amendment not regular or otherwise in order.

- 5. The amendment by V.Ex.Comp. George White to Article 87(a) is obviously designed to remove the six-month waiting period before applying for membership in Chapter as presently set out in Article 87(a). His wording of the amendment also removes the requirement that a Royal Arch Mason must remain during such membership a member in good standing of a Craft Lodge. It is fundamental and very basic to Royal Arch Masonry, that every Royal Arch Mason must be and remain a member in good standing of a Craft Lodge. Accordingly, with the wording used in the amendment proposed by V.Ex.Comp. White, your committee is unable to find this proposed amendment regular or otherwise in order.
- 6. R.Ex.Comp. Grant Parsons has proposed four amendments, the first to Article 69, where he proposes to deal with the responsibilities of the Public Relations Committee. One of the suggested amendments is to deal with the film "The Saga of the Holy Royal Arch".

He then proposes to amend Article 70 by forming a new committee for Membership Recruitment, Retention and Restoration and, again, he proposes to give the administration of the above film to this committee as well. Due to the actual wording of these two amendments, (the amendment purports to give the film and its distribution to two committees), your Committee is unable to find these amendments regular and in order. The third amendment proposes to deal with Article 55 (Standing Committees of the Grand Executive Committee) by adding the committee apparently referred to in the amendment to Article 70 to be a standing committee of the Grand Executive Committee. Your Committee has already found the amendments to Articles 69 and 70 not to be regular etc. and, accordingly, is unable to find this amendment to be regular and in order.

The fourth amendment to Article 29 proposes to add some responsibilities on the newly elected Grand Superintendent of the District with particular reference to naming and, accordingly, establishing district committees and their respective chairmen. This amendment takes away the authority of each Grand Superintendent of each district, (and it would seem that each district is different, and each different district may not want specific committees, that this amendment puts forward,) to establish or not to be established by each District Grand Superintendent. Therefore, as this proposed amendment restricts, or takes away, the accountability of the elected Grand Superintendent in each district, and the autonomy of each district, your Committee must find this proposed amendment not to be regular or in order.

As chairman of your committee I extend to the other members of the committee, R.Ex.Comp. Sheldon Boomhour and V.Ex.Comp. John V Lawer my sincere thanks for their assistance, with special thanks to the Grand Scribe Ezra, R.Ex.Comp. Melvyn Duke for all his help and the many courtesies extended to the committee during the last year.

All of which is respectfully submitted on behalf of the Committee, V.Ex.Comp. Norman E Byrne Chairman.

REPORT OF THE BURSARY COMMITTEE

To the Most Excellent the Grand First Principal, Officers and Companions of The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario

Most Excellent Sir and Companions:

The Scholarship and Bursary Fund was established to provide assistance to Royal Arch Masons, dependants of members, widows and orphans of members to complete their education at Universities, Community or Technical Colleges..

This Committee has awarded 34 Bursaries to students who qualified to receive our help, and 2 Medical Scholarships to the University of Toronto, for a total of \$9,800. Applications received this year were from 14 first year students, 9 second year students, 5 third year students and 6 fourth year students. Applications were received from District 1-1, District 2-3, District 5-5. District 6-5, District 8-7, District 10-4, District 12-5 and District 13-4. This year courses ranged from Teachers, Science Research, Film and Television Editor, Physiotherapist, Social Worker, Software Engineer, Police Officer, Veterinary Medicine,

Sports Doctor, Lawyer, Archaeologist and Aerospace Engineer to name a few..were pleased to receive letters and cards of thanks from these students who told of special evenings at the Chapters and the presentations by the Grand Superintendents or the Bursary Chairmen. The Committee extends its warmest thanks to each of the Companions who made presentations and to R.Ex.Comp. Melvyn Duke and the Grand Chapter Office for the assistance and information so willingly offered..

Thank you to all the Companions and Districts who have made contributions to the Grand Chapter Bursary Capital Fund. We would like to express the gratitude of the Committee to the Companion who donated \$110,466 to the Bursary Capital Fund. The interest from the investment of this large sum of money will certainly be a great encouragement to future chairmen and members of this committee and even more appreciated by the young people who apply for our bursaries.

I would like to thank the other six members of this committee for the support and effort in seeing that the work of this committee has been done efficiently. The bursary applications come in spread over the whole year and this has meant we have had to work every month and I am pleased to say the response has been 100%...

I thank the Grand First Principal for the opportunity of taking part in the workings of Grand Chapter, it has been an interesting experience and I am pleased to have been of service.

REPORT OF THE GRAND REPRESENTATIVES COMMITTEE

To the Most Excellent the Grand First Principal, Officers and Members of The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

Most Excellent Sir and Companions:

The Grand Representatives Committee is once again pleased to report its activities for the past Masonic year. Last fall a survey was again mailed to every Grand Representative in order to obtain accurate information concerning the Grand Representatives program and how it is working. The mailing included a cover letter on Committee letterhead and an information / opinion sheet to be filled out and returned.

The Committee received a reply from 42 of the 79 representatives, a 53% response. The Committee wishes to thank those Companions who responded to our request. Without your time this survey data wouldn't be possible.

The survey reveals the following facts:

• 32 of the 42, or 76% of Grand Representatives who replied made contact with their opposite member in the other Grand Jurisdiction.

This is up from only 54% making contact last year.

- 81% of this group claimed that they had a "GOOD" contact experience while 24% either didn't make contact or said that their contact experience was not very rewarding.
- Written letters seems to still be the favourite form of communication at 97%, however telephone and e-mail are making steady advances in this area. Even personal contact is up and stands at 22% of those who made contact
- The most common information discussed during these contacts are:

The proceedings @ 40%, discussion of Masonic life and bodies in general @40%, family life and personal information @28%. This last figure shows that the number of the Representative contacts that are making personal inroads is up compared to last year. This leads me to understand that more permanent, and genuine relationships are slowly bridging the Masonic gap around the world.

We also asked the question: "Do you feel the Grand Representatives program is working and should it be continued?"

- 62% claimed that it is working and are quite satisfied at its efficiency.
- 29% felt that it is in critical need of improvement or reform
- .05% were uncertain of its condition.

The next figure caught me a little by surprise

• The last part of the question asking if the Program should be continued, no one said directly that it should be discontinued. In fact most made the comment that it should be continued as it is a valuable tool and even though some had no success making contact they were more then willing to keep trying.

In Summary, the results of this year's survey indicate that the program is working on a more positive and rewarding level than last year. I believe more of our own Representatives are making a 150% effort to establish and maintain a rewarding contact with their counter part.

Even of the 24% who didn't make contact most have indicated that they are not willing to give up and will keep trying, for that we are thankful. Like any survey this one also holds some not so encouraging news as well as some complaints and problems. Copies of these comments are being passed on to the Grand Scribe Ezra and Grand Council for their consideration and resolution.

In conclusion, the Committee wishes to report to the Grand Chapter that it feels that our Grand Representatives Program is still in need of attention and updating, and even with the work done last year it seems that we haven't solved all the problems. Although with the commitment and determination of the Representatives who have willingly put forth a tireless effort it can be concluded that, better contact, more often, at more meaningful levels does seem to be at hand.

On behalf of the Committee and myself, we wish to thank M.Ex.Comp. McGill for the opportunity to serve on this committee so that we may do our part in the operations of our Grand Chapter.

Most Excellent Sir and Companions:

I would like to thank M.Ex.Comp. John McGill for my appointment to this committee. I would also like to recognize the support from our Grand Scribe Ezra and his staff for all their assistance, as well as our Grand Representatives.

We have only received thirty-four (34) reports this year from Sister Jurisdictions. It is interesting that some jurisdictions are still catching up by sending back copies. We received fourteen (14) reports for the year 2000, sixteen (16) for 1999, three (3) for 1998 and one (1) for 1997. The number of reports are all reported on this year. It is possible that because of our 2000 reports which are not available for distribution, our Grand Representatives have not corresponded that we have not received the usual reports.

It seems that most jurisdictions are experiencing the same problems with attendance, membership and people using the correct ritual work without the use of books. These appear to be similar to the problems being evident in Chapters. The membership appears to average a decline of 2% to 5% in most other jurisdictions.

In closing I would like to paraphrase and quote the Most Excellent Grand High Priest Robert B Malwitz of the Grand Chapter of Maryland; "We have the opportunity to grasp the future in our hands and to manage it in the short term. I suggest that we expand our efforts to help aid and support each other. We need to communicate better than we have. We need to visit each other more often. We need to go back into our lodges and offer a program to the Brethren. As part of the effort I recommend that we establish stronger links with our Grand Lodge."

After consultation with the Grand Scribe Ezra, we decided not to present a motion at the Grand Convocation regarding dropping the requirement to send in notification of the Most Excellent Master Degree within 10 days. Our Grand Chapter Staff is very small and benefits from an even flow of work over the course of the year rather than have it all arrive at once.

Some of the Grand Chapter forms were not in electronic format. All forms can now be computer generated however, further work will have to be done to convert the files to the different formats used by the Scribes Ezra.

We have spent much time creating, modifying and recreating a new Combination Registration form which has been designated TGC15. This form takes the place of five former Grand Chapter forms, and while giving the Grand Chapter all the information they need, it is simpler

for the Scribe Ezra of the Chapters to fill out and reduces the number of forms that they must deal with, a win-win solution. It will be presented at the November 2001 Grand Executive Meeting.

REPORT OF THE INVESTMENTS COMMITTEE

To the Most Excellent the Grand First Principal, Officers and Members of The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

Most Excellent Sir and Companions:

Background: At the Grand Executive Committee meeting of November 4, 2000, the Investments Committee presented an investment plan to the Grand Executive. As outlined in the Investment Plan, the objective of the fund is to provide a high level of income consistent with an emphasis on preservation of capital plus an exposure to growth type investments, providing potential for capital gain sufficient to protect the purchasing power of the fund and to meet a gradually increasing need for income. The role of the bonds in the fund is to provide a high level of stable income. The role of the equities in the fund is to provide the growth potential necessary to protect the purchasing power of the income.

The Investment Plan stipulates that equities should not go above 35% of the market value of the portfolio, especially for charitable funds.

It is the recommendation of the Investments Committee that this plan be reviewed annually by the Investments Committee, and updated if necessary.

The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario Notes to the Financial Statements February 28, 2001

1 Nature of Operations: The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario is a not for profit organization which serves as the central administrative body for Masonic Chapters in the Province of Ontario. The organization is exempt from income tax under the Income Tax Act.

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Inventories: Inventories of supplies for sale and for use are valued at cost.

Fixed Assets: Fixed assets are stated at acquisition cost. New additions are not depreciated in accordance with generally accepted accounting principals but are charged to expenditure in the year of acquisition. The cost of additions is then added to the accumulated cost of fixed assets in the records and to accumulated depreciation.

Revenue recognition: The organization follows the deferral method of accounting contributions whereby restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expenses are incurred. Revenue from operations is recognized at the time goods are shipped or services are supplied to members.

Income from investments: Dividends are recorded as revenue when received. Interest on investments is recognized as income when it becomes due. Premiums or discounts on investments are expended or recognized as income, when incurred.

4 Financial Instruments: The financial instruments of the organization include cash, receivables, payables and portfolio investments. The fair market values of cash, receivables and payables are assumed to approximate their carrying amounts because of their short term maturity. The fair values of investments are assumed to approximate quoted values. Market value of the investment portfolio is \$390,789 (2000 - \$334,531).

Included in investments are share in York Masonic Temple Limited, received as part of the dissolution of a particular chapter. These shares are recorded in the books at a nominal value of \$1 per share. Portfolio investments are placed in well capitalized, high quality corporate and government securities. The organization does not use derivative instruments to reduce its exposure to interest and foreign currency risk. The organization has not significant concentrations of credit risk.

5 Restricted Net Assets: The net assets restricted for Commuted Membership represents funds that have accumulated with respect to lifetime membership payments. Some chapter members have made lump sum payments to satisfy future membership obligations. These net assets are subject to internally imposed restrictions stipulating that the resources be maintained to provide annualized returns intended to compensate the organization for the costs of servicing these members.

The net assets restricted for Victory Thanksgiving Benevolence are internally restricted for purposes of providing welfare assistance to companions and their families in need. These amounts are not available for other purposes without the approval of the membership.

6 Related Entities: The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario (The Grand Chapter) exercises significant influence over both The Grand Chapter - Scholarship and Bursary Fund and The Grand Chapter - Medical Research Fund. The Grand Chapter annually appoints the board of directors for both organizations. Both related entities are registered charities under the income tax act.

The Scholarship and Bursary Fund was established to provide assistance to Royal Arch Masons, dependants of members, widows and orphans of members to complete their education at universities, community or technical colleges. The Medical Research Fund was established to provide funds for medical research upon receiving a valid request for assistance.

Neither the Scholarship and Bursary Fund nor the Medical Research Fund have been consolidated in the Grand Chapter financial statements. Financial summaries of these unconsolidated entities as at February 29, 2000 and 1999 and for the years then ended are as follows:

Most Excellent Sir and Companions:

Your Finance Committee has reviewed the monthly Financial Statements of the Grand Treasurer, monitoring the progress in comparison to the Budget Estimates approved by Grand Chapter April 2000. With the appointment of the Chairman of the Investment Committee as a member of the Finance Committee, considerable dialogue and interchange of information and ideas has taken place between these two Committees, again during the past year, to their mutual benefit and that of our Grand Chapter. The Committee acknowledges the Grand Scribe Ezra and the Grand Treasurer's assistance in providing the information required. The February year end Financial Statement has been reviewed in detail. And, subsequently the Financial Statements prepared by our Auditor, Comp. George Benton of Grant Thornton. We are satisfied that they present the financial operations of our Grand Chapter during the last fiscal year. It is pleasant to note that Grand Chapter had a surplus of revenue over expense of \$8,718.

We compliment the Grand Council and the Kitchener Convocation Committee on their fiscal results for the 2000 Annual Convocation.

We are budgeting Revenue for this fiscal year to February 28th, 2002 of \$ 92,900 and Expenses of \$ 93,540. A budgeted deficit of \$ 640. Your Finance Committee has included a 3% increase in office salaries. The first increase since 1998-1999 (3 years). We are confident that the expenditures are appropriate and the receipts, while showing a small deficit, are conservatively reliable.

We recommend to the Finance Committee for the ensuing year, that a plan for the Commutation of Grand Chapter Per/Capita be prepared for consideration. Life membership Programs in Constituent Chapters promote membership retention. An important issue for the 21st Century.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE CONDITION OF CAPITULAR MASONRY

To the Most Excellent the Grand First Principal, Officers and Members of The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

Most Excellent Sir and Companions:

It is with great pleasure that I present the Report of the Committee on the Condition of Capitular Masonry on behalf of the 16 Grand Superintendents. There are some areas that have been raised in the year end reports from the Grand Superintendents that I would like to address.

A number of the Grand Superintendents stated that because a Master Mason can now go directly to the Shrine, that Royal Arch Masonry is in trouble. How many Royal Arch Masons currently attend Chapter on a regular basis? I believe that in most cases, you would find that the number attending is less than 20% of the actual membership. The main reason for this is that, in the past, we have simply been a stepping stone to the Shrine and only our dedicated members continue to keep our body alive. I believe that the Shrines' decision to accept Master Masons directly is a sign that they are in trouble not Royal Arch Masonry. It means, that those who now join our Fraternity are anxious to be a member and we should take advantage of this situation by putting these new members to work as soon as possible to keep their interest in Royal Arch Masonry. We must also look at those members who have not been out to Chapter and change how we conduct our meetings to encourage them to come back to Chapter. We can accomplish this by trying new things such as having more Masonic education during the meetings and organizing events in which families can also participate. Why not have a social evening when the ladies are present, a barbecue, a bus trip to the theatre, a fishing derby, a golf tournament, a curling bonspiel and the list can go on. We have to be inventive to not only bring back our senior members but to keep our new members. It is very discouraging to a new member to see only a handful of people present when he takes his degree.

Another area in which there has been considerable discussion is that the policies and procedures that we follow are out of date. We need to remind ourselves that all Principals and Past Principals are members of Grand Chapter and that the Grand Executive and the Grand Council must follow the Constitution. If a Companion is upset by a decision made by this body, they should be encouraged to offer a change to the Constitution that can be debated and voted on at the annual Convocation of Grand Chapter. Don't just sit and complain about the way we operate, offer real solutions for change. We should act by the old Nike promotion and "Just Do It".

It has been suggested that the members of the Grand Council and Grand Executive are not making themselves available to the Companions. The Grand Superintendent, in the District, is the representative of the Grand First Principal. If there is a problem in a Chapter or a District, they should use all of their resources to find a solution to the problem including consulting with the members in their Districts and contacting the Grand Chapter office for advice when they are unable to resolve the problem. The Grand Council and the Grand Executive members are always available to offer assistance when asked, but we need to know the concerns of the members. We all need to work together to make our organization strong so that it will continue for many years to come, but we must communicate for this to happen.

I would like to end on a positive note that not all Districts are having these problems and even those who raised these observations are encouraged for the prospects of Royal Arch Masonry. I was pleased to read that all Districts advised that the condition of Royal Arch Masonry is alive and well and the prospects for the future are encouraging. In most cases it was reported that where amalgamations have taken place, the Chapters are flourishing with new Candidates joining. This is especially the case when the two Chapters had a close working relationship prior to the amalgamation process.

Yes we do have some concerns but if we all work together I am sure we will overcome these bumps in the road. Life is not easy and we all face difficulties but by working together many hands make the task easier.

As I begin, may I humbly express my appreciation for being appointed chair of this very important post. I was hopeful and would be pleased, to have been named to support any committee. I was quite a surprise since I still consider myself to be a neophyte to the workings of this Grand body.

My tenure started with difficulty. Researching the committee members addresses and phone numbers proved arduous as the Grand Chapter office does not possess such a database of membership in a format that would provide easy reference of the Excellent Companions of our Grand jurisdiction. To this end, I would recommend that our Grand Chapter formulate such a directory. To this end, I would submit that this committee needs to be expanded further, or at least the latitude of enlisting the aid of the talented area Companions increased, to be able to attend and operate at these larger functions of longer terms. It is too much to expect one or two relatively close committee members to step out of their secular life, with the travel that may still be required and often the staying in hotel residence with its' cost and inconvenience. It may be a viable alternative to appoint a small number from within, and attached to, each District. This would, by arrangement, place committee members in the area of any requests, and these individuals, hailing from their individual area, would be familiar with their piece of our Jurisdiction and accessible to fellow Companions with the eye of enlisting of their assistance.

Since the flurry of activity between our presence at Grand Lodge in mid July and the plowing match in mid September the requests for attendance and participation of this committee has been minimal. Further, requests for our presence was found to be rather last minute ordeals, thereby proving to be an arduous process.

An appeal of these to be more timely should be expressed and made known. On the direction of R.Ex.Comp. Boomhour, all copies of the film "Saga of the Holy Royal Arch" and all of the displays boards have been directed to be surrendered and returned to the Grand Chapter Office.

This will allow the boards to be continually updated of common material, pictures, etc., save all of these items from unequal distribution and remove the need to pass on these lecture aids to committee member successors. As needed, they are transported to the desired locations for use. The publication "The Keystone" was placed in hiatus a couple of years ago that the budget may be redirected towards a full page submission into the Grand Lodge publication, "The Ontario Mason". There it has remained, and to the best of my knowledge or awareness, there are no immediate plans to resurrect it.

R.Ex. Comp. Sheldon Boomhour has requested an "action plan" to be undertaken by all of the Grand Chapter committees. I had determined that this Public Relations Committee would undertake to re-produce the film "Saga of the Holy Royal Arch". This presentation aid, while a cinematic award winner, is taken from an American perspective, which is logical as it is an American production. Also as it being somewhat older, it has been said, even criticized, as being "dated". My endeavour was to rewrite it from the perspective of this jurisdiction, while updating it to make it current to today. It was suggested at the Grand Executive Meeting in November at Midland, that this could be formatted in the Power Point computer program, which I do not know. Nevertheless, it is my regret that this project never got beyond the desire and concept stage. If this project is deemed desirable, then perhaps successive committees may adopt this venture or Grand Chapter itself may see it as of value sufficient to assign select and talented Companions able to accomplish this.

Historically and operatively, this committee has responded to requests to attend functions in the community, for the benefit, exposure and information of non-masons, at Lodge meetings, and fraternal gatherings for the purpose of inciting the interest and desire of potential new members and at Chapter functions for the general interest and education of our Companions. While similar in theory, in practise, these targets groups and purposes are diametrically opposed. This is the PUBLIC RELATIONS committee and by strict definition of its' title, should be dedicated to addressing and enlightening the public with the information and education appropriate to that group. The appeal to prospective applicants should be the providence of a committee mandate to that purpose. Further to this direction of recruitment could also be the issue and effort of member restoration and retention.

I would like to thank the collective members of this committee who have so congenially responded to my appeals and so ably offered advise based on so much experience. Their commitment to this Grand Chapter is obvious by their efforts and dedication to the work of this committee. They have always been prompt to return my calls and lend their time, efforts, expertise and advice. Particular appreciation is extended to R.Ex.Comps Eugene de Beaupre and William Glover as they have exhibited so much help to me and so much dedication to the cause of this Grand Chapter through this committee's efforts.

My term on this committee has been quite the introduction to the operations of this Grand Chapter. It has been an invaluable experience and I am eternally indebted to you, Most Excellent Sir, for this opportunity and your confidence in me. I hope it has not been ill placed.

LONG RANGE PLANNING COMMITTEE

To the Most Excellent, The Grand First Principal, Officers and Companions of The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario:

Most Excellent Sir and Companions:

The goal of the Long Range Planning Committee is to set forth suggestions and plan for the governance of this Grand Chapter over the next five years. A long-range plan (to be reviewed annually) is important in meeting the challenges and in maintaining continuity towards a vision of the future. This committee has examined reports of the previous five years, assessing the strengths and weaknesses in the following areas: Membership, Communication, Governance, Financial/Human Resources, and Technology and Communications. If there is one need that emerges most strongly, it is communication, communication, and communication. In every aspect of Grand Chapter communication is a key issue to provide a stronger, more focussed and informed Grand Chapter. Communication at the Grand Executive level, as well as to and from Chapters and Companions is fundamental to our success as a viable Masonic body.

What an opportunity the Grand Executive meetings offer for the Grand Council. It is here that the Grand First Principal could give a "state of the union" address to inform us of the plans he has for the next few months. It should also be an occasion for the Grand Executive to discuss specific issues upon which the Grand Council wishes input and permission to execute programs requiring funding. It is proposed that the following actions he undertaken to better define the of the Grand Council, the Grand Executive and the various committees.

- 1. The Grand Executive should be made more fully responsible for the administrative and executive functions of Grand Chapter by:
- (a) Reviewing and redefining authorities and responsibilities.
- (b) Reviewing and perhaps reducing in size and composition the committee to keep it responsive to the tasks at hand.
- (c) Establishing such a schedule of meetings as may be considered necessary. Quarterly meetings should not be considered as excessive.
- (d) Establishing a policy that all officers and members of the Grand Executive generally chair various committees.
- (e) Redefining roles and responsibilities of all committees, considering them all as Grand Chapter Committees.
- (f) Including an agenda item at Grand Executive meetings "Meeting with the Grand Council."
- (g) Collecting and distributing the names addresses, telephone numbers and email addresses for all Members of the Grand Executive by the Grand Scribe Ezra. This would vastly improve networking and sharing of information. All members must provide this information.
- (h) Reviewing the structure of the Grand Executive. This will require the willingness of Grand Council and Grand Executive to consider, recommend and implement changes to the laws, rules and regulations. This will demand great thought as to what constitutes an infringement of the ancient usages, customs and landmarks.
- (i) Establishing an action list to catalogue the decisions of Grand Executive with respect to the recommendations of Long Range Planning Committees since 1991.
- 2. While we have been most fortunate in having a Grand Scribe Ezra who has undertaken countless duties increasing needs will require further assistance as new programs are introduced.

- 3. Steady communication between Grand Chapter and Chapters should be encouraged to discuss any difficulties and possible solutions.
- 4. Grand Council should continue to seriously consider committee recommendations while ensuring that the final disposition is communicated to the committee.
- 5. With increasing numbers of amalgamations, realignment of districts is needed to foster closer ties within the Masonic communities geographically to better reflect the relationship between the Chapters and the Craft Lodges from which they draw their membership. The election of Grand Superintendents for two-year terms has some support, especially in the smaller districts.
- 6. Introduction of new and revised programs would strongly indicate the leadership of Grand Chapter:
- (a) Pre-training of Grand Superintendents
- (b) Training of Chapter Scribes.
- (c) Masonic education —including written literature, videotape and PowerPoint presentations.
- (d)More frequent use of Chapters of Instruction.
- 7. Fraternal visits to the districts by the First Grand Principal, the Grand Second Principal and the Grand Third Principal, should continue to be promoted with as much fanfare as possible.
- 8. Photographs and information should be published for elected office: This would correspond to the practice of Grand Lodge.

Nurture and promote Royal Arch Masonry:

- 1) Mission Statement: "Royal Arch Masonry will continue the Solomonic Degrees begun in the Craft and reinforce Masonic principles and tenets.
- 2) Changes to the Constitution should be considered to permit Chapters to open, without opening in the Royal Arch, but solely in the Mark and Most Excellent Master Degrees for business and performing the work of the evening, as is the case in the Grand Chapter of Saskatchewan. This would permit more time being devoted to the degree.
- 3) Lodges can now devote up to 20% of their summons to other bodies such as Royal Arch Masonry. Royal Arch items should be written for use in lodge summonses.
- 4) Bursaries for needy students should be advertised by a letter size poster to be placed on the Students' assistance board in the Colleges and or Universities.
- a. An academic achievement award at a College where the Grand Superintendent presents it during the Award Ceremony provides an opportunity to expand on all facets of our charitable work.
- b. Royal Arch Charities and Bursaries should he better promoted within the Community and fraternity. Consideration should he given to creating a special "Charity Medallion" to mark contributions of a specific total amount over a specified period of time (\$200 or more over 5 years) to our Charities or Bursaries.

Leadership and Training

- 1. Joint programs in concert with Grand Lodge should be developed to promote Masonry in general and Royal Arch Masons in particular.
- 2. Grand Chapter should build upon the Leadership and Training programs of Grand Lodge. After a Mason has completed the four courses of the College of' Freemasonry and become a Fellow of the College, Grand Chapter could consider a fifth course which would be the College course re: Administration for Grand Chapter would earn an additional certificate. This would also ensure that RAM's are continuing to support the Grand Lodge structure.
- 3. Grand Chapter should consider developing a standard course of instruction for Chapter Officers, especially the three Principals. Mandatory attendance should be required at that Course of Instruction by any companion elected to the office of Third, Second or First Principal of a Chapter.
- 4. The three Principals of a Chapter should receive a letter, after their investiture, directly from the Grand First Principal congratulating them on their election reminding them of the full range of their duties stressing.
- a) that the Scribes Ezra in every Chapter must inform the First Principal about Grand Chapter directives so that they are followed.
- b) visiting other Chapters is as important as for the Craft Lodges

The entire issue of leadership training is crucial to life in Canada and few realize it. Grand Lodge, Grand Chapter, Sovereign Great Priory , Royal and Select Masters, Allied Masonic Degrees, etc. should meet to define an integrated strategy to build leaders of tomorrow, not just for Freemasonry, but for society as a whole.

Financial and Human Resources

- 1) A review of budgets from 1995/96 to 2000/01 indicates that efforts to reduce costs have been successful.
- 2) Reducing the frequency of the Grand Convocations to every second year, corresponding to the election and installation of the officers, could provide for a saving of \$3500 to \$5000 in the "off year".
- i) A one day business formatted meeting would require one conference room only at an estimated cost of \$1000. The cost of printing the proceedings should also be reduced.
- ii) It is recommended that a review of the convocation expenses should be undertaken at the fall Grand Executive Meeting immediately after the Grand Convocation. The budget for the next convocation can be set at the same time.
- iii) It is recommended that Grand Chapter establish a two man permanent committee to set-up convocations with the Grand Scribe Ezra and Grand First Principal.
- 3) The Grand Chapter Long Range Financial Plan should evaluate operating costs and methods to reduce/enhance, and to define internal controls. We must be thankful to the companions charged with the financial oversight who have done such a commendable job.

4) Grand Chapter should develop a handbook of financial management for use by all Chapters. Technological and Communication: Communication, communication, communication! Our Grand Chapter web site is a most valuable tool for communication. It could carry "The Keystone" in electronic format with one copy per Chapter mailed versus every Companion.

Efforts should continue to improve electronic efficiencies in office activities. All forms should be computer formatted and their use by constituent Chapters be greatly encouraged. Greater use of electronic mail should be encouraged to reduce postage and handling costs.

While many Companions had contributions to this section, R.Ex.Comp. Denis Amendola who teaches web sites and technology information offered these insights.

- 1. One of the best tools for any organization is its ability to be open and create a curiosity for those who first access the web site. A Grand Chapter web site could provide a list of Chapter Numbers, followed by the Chapter name, Scribe's name as an e-mail link set up by Province, District or individual Chapters.
- 2. To decrease the printing and mailing costs Grand Chapter word processor forms could be saved on the web site and downloaded as "Acrobat pdf' MS Word or WordPerfect files. Completed forms could be printed and mailed or e-mailed to the Grand Scribe Ezra, The ordering of supplies could also be set up in a simple form.
- 3. Scribes Ezra should have an ID-PASSWORD registration access. As Scribe's submit new applicants, deaths and suspensions forms, a "cgi" script could update each Chapter's database, thereby providing an immediate roll of members.

Conclusion: A much more integrated approach should be pursued by Grand Chapter in partnership with Grand Lodge, Sovereign Great Priory, Royal and Select Masters and, to a lesser extent, the AMD. Each serves a decreasing number of Masons who move to these bodies, and each exemplifies different aspects of the fundamental principles on which the entire system is built. The long run success of both our membership development and retention programs will ultimately depend upon the member satisfaction with individual Chapters which are supported by the Grand Chapter. Grand Chapter must overcome the challenges facing this us with a long-range plan that sets specific goals. Criteria for evaluating performance of the Strategic Plan must be specified as we progress. It must be regularly monitored and evaluated. Finally, my Companions, I leave you with the following thought, "A plan without time lines and measurable landmarks is nothing but a dream."


