Recently we were honoured to have been able to take part in the placing of the 150th Commemorative stone at the Grand Lodge building, and Grand Chapter Office in Hamilton when so many companions were able to be present to witness the event. At that time I mentioned how intertwined the Grand Lodge and the Grand Chapter were right from the time of M.W.Bro. Wm Mercer Wilson who was first Grand Master of our Grand Lodge and First Grand First Principal of our Grand Chapter. My research assistant V.Ex.Comp. John Sutherland of my Chapter, Oxford-Harris No. 18 in Ingersoll, tells me that in fact there were 12 Grand First Principals who went on to serve as Grand Master in this Province and two out of Province.

Most Ex.Comp. Gifford, I have enjoyed my travels with you over the course of this year in Craft Lodge settings and have appreciated your willing participation as one of the Leaders of the Family of Freemasonry. Mary and I have enjoyed the company of both you and your wife Carol when we have been together. I look forward to working with your successor.

You know companions, this year we initiated three new projects.... one being MasoniChip, a child identification program offering a sense of security to parents whose children could go missing...it touches a sensitive spot as it concerns children's welfare and as a result it has taken off like wildfire with four hotspots around Ontario under program director R.W.Bro. and Comp. Ray Dobbs of Woodstock. The side benefit to this program may be an increase

in public awareness of the Masons.

We put into place a Youth Initiatives Committee, V.W.Bro and Comp. Bill Atkinson Sr. as chairman, to liaise with Demolay, Job's Daughters and Rainbow Girls. This too has brought a lot of awareness to these groups and most recently the Deputy GM, the chairman and I attended a Provincial meeting where they initiated 17 youngsters into Demolay and conferred the Demolay Degree on 20 in total bringing their numbers up to 145 Demolay youth across Ontario. They ended the day with a very successful banquet and dancing with almost 200 in attendance. I am most pleased with the work of this committee in providing support to these youth groups.

My charity project being Prostate Cancer Research has allowed us the opportunity to bring awareness to this dreaded male problem and I might say that many are sympathetic to the cause as donations to Project number 2244 continues to be received. In addition to this, in my travels, I have been able to stress starting PSA screening early at least at age 40. It establishes a baseline for comparison as you age. It may save your life.

Brethren my theme for this year has been 'Masonry Making a Difference' especially in the following ways:

In your own life....by following the principles of brotherly love, relief and truth and practising those virtues which make a good man better such as....honesty in business, courtesy in society, dependability, fairness in work, concern for the less fortunate, respect for one another, acting charitably, being prudent and using sound judgement.

In the lives of others...by having due consideration and regard for others. As Masons we have an opportunity to truly make a difference....we can do so by adhering to the well known principle of Freemasonry....in becoming better husbands, better men, and better masons....If you live your life as a Mason should, then you will make a difference in the lives of others.

In your Lodge...by practising tolerance and showing equality with a natural kindness and a bond of fraternal love with all those who have shared the same experiences. This should be what keeps Masons coming out to Lodge.

In your Community...by being helpful, practising those principles of charity and forgiveness learned in lodge, and just being the good neighbour....kind, considerate and peaceful, conforming to lawful authorities. Be a part of your community.

It is an honor and a privilege for me to welcome you to the 150th Annual Convocation of The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

Most Worshipful Brother Allan J Petrisor, I would like to thank you for all the courtesies that have been extended, not only to myself, but also to this Grand Chapter, its Officers and members over the past months. I can assure you, that I speak for all Royal Arch Masons, when I state once again that the wishes and support of our Grand Lodge is of the utmost importance to each and every one of us and, we are ready to serve whenever requested. The attendance at this Convocation by you, Most Worshipful Sir and your wife Mary are greatly appreciated. Your leadership, dedication and commitment to Masonry are and will continue to be an inspiration to each and every mason in this province.

To the Convocation Committee under the leadership of R.Ex.Comp. Douglas Overy of Pentalpha Chapter No 28, Oshawa – the energy and efforts put forward on behalf of this Grand Chapter over the past two years has been greatly appreciated.

To the management and staff of the Quality Hotel Parkway Convention Centre – thank you for your assistance and guidance once again, in making this a special event.

NECROLOGY: Once again I would like to thank R.Ex.Comp. David Whiston, our Grand Chaplain, for a very moving and sincere ceremony of remembrance. I extend my personal condolences as well as those of this Grand Chapter to the families and friends of our departed Companions. They will be missed by the Companions of their various Chapters and Districts as well as the Companions with whom they have become acquainted in other jurisdictions.

FRATERNAL RELATIONS: The Ontario Masonic Leaders Committee under the guidance and chairmanship of our Grand Master continues to meet on a regular basis. As my term of office ends and our new Grand First Principal assumes the duties of sitting on this committee I wish for all those involved, harmony and wisdom in all their deliberations. The ideals and principals of Freemasonry within as well as without our great fraternity can only benefit from their continued efforts on our behalf. The chairman, our Grand Master, on all occasions encourages and listens to all suggestions and concerns prior to the making of any decisions.

PAST RANK: In accordance with a request from the Principals and Companions of Hiawatha Chapter No 252, I recommend Past First Principal rank be conferred on Comp. Gordon J Simmons. Reverend Gordon J Simmons has served masonry well and is held in high esteem in all branches of the order with which he is affiliated.

CONDITIONS OF THE ORDER: Once again as usual our Grand Council met immediately following the 149th Grand Convocation and by all reports we had a very successful Convocation. The attendance of 8 Past Grand First Principals was a very impressive show of support for this Grand Chapter. The warm-up to the 150th Anniversary by the Pipe and Drum Corp was very well received and a very moving experience by those in attendance.

On April 28, 2007 I directed the Grand Second Principal, Roland A Paddle to form two Committees as stated in my 2007 address:

(1) The viability and interest in E-mailing the Chapter Summons

right to vote at this Grand Chapter.

(2) The viability in 2 a year term for Grand Superintendent for District No 15.

As you can see from the Summons, two Notices of Motion are being presented later at this Grand Convocation.

On January the 25th 2008, I directed R.Ex. Comp. Roland P Mandeville to contact the 15 Grand Superintendents and ask them to remind all the Chapters in their respective Districts to ensure they were properly returned by January 31, 2008, as outlined in the Constitution. This was done by the sending of 12 E-Mail and 15 Regular mail letters. As of February 1, 2008, we had 11 Chapters not properly returned and a letter of suspension was issued. The First Principals of the delinquent Chapters were given until February 20, 2008 to provide a written response as to why their respective Chapters were in violation of the Constitution. As of February 29, 2008, I am pleased to report that 8 Chapters and their respective First Principal's responded in an appropriate manner and the suspensions have been lifted. As no response was received the following Chapters, Alberton Chapter No 152; Abitibi Chapter No 223 and Tecumseh

Chapter No 264, they were suspended and their three Principals and Proxies are denied the

I will state once again that over the last few years the Grand Council has made every attempt to have all Chapters returned by the proper date as outlined in the Constitution. All that we ask is that the forms are properly filled out showing their respective situations as of December 31st and the assessment paid. We could have had a near perfect return if the assessment which was issued in November had have been punctually paid and the forms properly submitted. This information is what is printed in the Proceedings and used for assessment purposes. Should a Chapter fail to send in the proper forms then we have no way of knowing who is or is not eligible to vote at our Grand Convocation.

There are currently 3 Chapters under Trusteeship in accordance with the Grand Chapter Constitution.

I have appointed R.Ex.Comp. Gordon McEwen as trustee to over see the workings and make recommendations on the viability of Northern Lights Chapter No 213 in Timmins. A report was received and the Chapter has requested another 12 months to try and turn this chapter around. It is therefore recommended that they be given this opportunity. V.Ex.Comp. Jon Bowman has been appointed trustee to oversee Tillsonburg Chapter No 255 and assist them in improving the quality of work and the streamlining of their operations.

R.Ex.Comp. John Howden has been appointed trustee to assist Minnewawa Chapter No 78 in alleviating internal issues which have come to the attention of the Grand Superintendent of District No. 2.

As their term of office expires at this Grand Convocation I would suggest that they be reappointed for a further term of office in order to have continuity and give them a chance to complete their commissions.

In addition, R.Ex.Comp. Needham Throop has been appointed as a representative to oversee and assist during the Amalgamation proceedings between Ancient Frontenac and Cataraqui Chapter No 1 in Kingston and Mount Sinai Chapter No 44 in Napanee.

While we are on this subject I feel that it is important that you know there are other Chapters in various stages of discussion regarding their well being and viability. I hope and pray that those concerned will be able to find a satisfactory solution to their respective problems.

Once again, any Special Dispensations which were previously issued to Chapters will be null and void at the completion of this Grand Convocation thereby requiring a new written request for continuance.

From the Nomination papers received on November 30, 2007 there were five nominations for elected office denied due to non-compliance with the Constitution.

Once again the Grand Chapter Office is only open on a part time basis and I would strongly recommend that all correspondence be sent in writing and by letter or fax. There are proper procedures to follow when corresponding with our Grand Chapter and these procedures are to be strictly followed by all Chapters.

The Grand Chapter Office does not have an email address and nothing concerning our Grand Chapter should be forwarded to the Grand Scribe Ezra's personal email address.

The Soapbox Newsletter, which is being sent to each Chapter and Grand Chapter Officer quarterly, has given the Grand Council a better opportunity to communicate with the companions and bring forward information on various subjects in a timely manner. This newsletter, once again, should be placed in an appropriate place in the anteroom where more Companions would be able to read its contents and not left in the pile of correspondence at the end of the meeting. The newsletter is also on the Grand Chapter website. The Grand Chapter website has been and continues to be a very good vehicle for the dissemination of information concerning, not only Grand Chapter information but, also gives the various Chapters in the Province a method of sharing by photos or written media, their special events.

Again this year, as well as in the past, our Grand Chapter Office in Hamilton was open to any and all Companions in the Province who wished to visit for whatever reason. All that was required was a letter stating when the visit was intended and all efforts would have been made to accommodate those Companions.

CHARITABLE ACTIVITIES: A little more than a year ago, R.Ex.Comp. Maurice E. (Ted) Jenkins approached me with the idea of creating a Million Dollar Club. I am pleased to say as of the writing of this address that under his stewardship we have 106 members raising \$10,600 and a number of subscriptions which have given this endeavor a further \$7,400 giving us a total

of \$18,000. Congratulations to you R. Ex. Comp. Jenkins on a job well done and I hope that you will continue into the future with this excellent idea. These contributions as well as those of the various Chapters and Companions towards our goal of a \$1,000,000 Capital Fund will strengthen our ability to maintain our support of the Medical Research programs that have become so important to the Royal Arch Masons of this Province.

GRAND SUPERINTENDENTS: The District Superintendents on all occasions have attempted to perform their respective duties to the best of their skill and ability. I extend my personal thanks as well as that of all the Companions for a job well done.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON CONSTITUTION, LAWS AND JURISPRUDENCE

To the Most Excellent the Grand First Principal, Officers and Members of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

Most Excellent Sir and Companions:

I am pleased as Chairman of this Committee to present the Committee Report for the year 2007-2008 covering administration under its mandate during the above period, together with other matters dealt with by the Committee as required by the Constitution of Grand Chapter under Article 59.

NOTICES OF MOTION:

- 1. I, R.Ex.Comp. Roland A Paddle give Notive that at the Annual Convocation of Grand Chapter, I will move, or cause to be moved that the following sentence be added to RULES GOVERNING GRAND CHAPTER OFFICERS Section 25 (a) "The full term of office for the Grand Superintendent of District 15 shall be two consecutive years", so that the Section shall read:
- 25 (a) Except as provided in Section POWERS AND AUTHORITY OF GRAND CHAPTER and in Section DUTIES, POWER AND RULES REGARDING THE GRAND FIRST PRINCIPAL, herof, no Officer is entitled to Past Rank in any office in Grand Chapter, unless he has served a full term of office and expressly granted by Grand Chapter. The full term of

office for the Grand Superintendent of District 15 shall be two consecutive years.

Your Committee finds this amendment to be regular and in order.

District 15 has only three Constituent Chapters in the District, and to travel to the Grand Convocation in central Ontario, Companions must drive to either Thunder Bay or Winnipeg, Manitoba, for air transportation back east, and then rent a vehicle to reach their destination. They are in a similar situation to the Companions in the Yukon District when they were under the umbrella of the Grand Chapter until 1958. The Constitution in that era dealt with the problem by only one sentence in the section dealing with Past Rank, and the Committee finds that solution to still be regular and in order.

- 2. I, R.Ex.Comp. David G Walker will move or cause to be moved at the next Annual Convocation of the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario; that whereas the Grand Lodge A.F. & A.M. of Canada in the Province of Ontario; after extensive review and consultation amended its Constitution in July 2004, to permit the emailing of Lodge summons, and whereas Grand Chapter has conducted similar review and tests, that therefore Section 79 paragraph (a) of the Constitution be amended to read:
- 79 (a) The content of a Chapter Summons is confidential information and shall be mailed in a sealed envelope with return address or by authorized, secure electronic transmission via e-mail. Responsibility for contents sent in unsealed envelopes or unauthorized electronic transmission rests with the First Principal and Scribe Ezra.

Your Committee finds this amendment to be regular and in order.

The following procedure is not part of the Constitution:

Conditions required for the issuing of Dispensation to a Chapter to transmit its Summons by secure electronic transmission via e-mail include:

- (i) The Scribe E or the responsible companion of the Chapter has attended an appropriate seminar.
- (ii) The Chapter will decide to use or not to use a password on the e-mail document.
- (iii) The Scribe E has on record a signed "request form" or e-mail request from the Chapter member agreeing to receive the Chapter's Summons by e-mail and agreeing that it is the member's responsibility to keep the Scribe E informed of his current e-mail address.
- (iv) The content of the e-mail summons is the same as that sent by post.
- (v) Grand Chapter and the Grand Superintendent must receive their summons by regular surface post.

Requests from a Chapter for Dispensation from Grand Chapter to transmit its Summons by secure electronic transmission via e-mail must include agreement to the foregoing conditions.

Since last reporting to the Grand First Principal and the Companions of Grand Chapter in 2007, your Committee has dealt with seven (7) issues brought to their attention pertaining to interpretations as per our mandate under the Constitution.

In addition fifteen (15) submissions from Constituent Chapters pertaining to Amendments to their By-laws have been received, reviewed and recommendations made to the Grand First Principal for either approval, minor changes before receiving his approval, or not recommended for approval.

Further, a diligent student of the Constitution (2006) brought to our attention a misprint in Section 92, undoubtedly caused by a word processor having a mind of its own. We have recommended that this misprint be corrected in the next printing of the Constitution.

All of the above is respectfully submitted on behalf of the Committee, V.Ex.Comps. Donald H Mumby, Grant H Armstrong and R.Ex.Comp. J William Lidstone as Committee Chairman.

REPORT OF THE BURSARY COMMITTEE

To the Most Excellent, The Grand First Principal, Officers, and Companions of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

Most Excellent Sir and Companions:

The Scholarship and Bursary Committee would like to thank you for the opportunity to serve this Grand Chapter for the past 12 months. Now with our term almost complete, I am pleased to inform you of our activity over the past year.

This year 66 applications were received, 56 having been approved and 10 were rejected. A total of \$20,400.00 of our \$23,752.00 budget has been awarded.

This year 34 - 1st & 2nd year 22 - 3rd & 4th year applications approved. This would indicate that once again this year there are still a lot of new students beginning the early stages of college

or university education and leaves just under 40% of the applications received from students in the final stages of their education, poised to be the leaders of tomorrow.

As you know this committee has recently implemented a number of changes to our application process and forms as we continue our attempt to rectify the delay problems of the past. We feel reasonably comfortable with results to date, however there are always exceptions. This year a small portion of the applications refused were again due to delays. Please keep in mind that once an application reaches a certain point of delay the information it contains must be considered out of date and possibly inaccurate. At this point the application will be refused and a request that a new application with current information be re submitted. This tough decision of refusal has caused a few to view this committee as uncaring and callous towards these worthy students but, however difficit this decision was to make, we do have to answer to our government regulators.

Once again this year I ask that the instructions be read carefully when filling out the applications and stress that they are forwarded through the proper channels as soon as possible, hesitation causes delays. Remember only the Students suffer from these delays!

As in the past couple of years this Committee has worked to streamline the application process and this year is no exception. The changes that have been made this year are:

- 1) This committee will now have a cut off date by which applications are to be received in order for them to be processed within that current year. This means that applications shall begin to be received immediately following the Grand Convocation in April and will continue to be received up to and including the date of January 15th prior to the next annual convocation. Any applications received after this January 15th cut off date will be held until the Grand Convocation and at that time be passed along to the new Chairman and his committee for their consideration. This timing will allow all applications for that Masonic year to be received, processed and if approved the cheques to be issued by the end of February, Grand Chapter's fiscal year end. This plan will enable the committee to complete its year efficiently, within its government guidelines and with no carry over each year. Having no carry over is intended to make the transition to the incoming Scholarship & Bursary Chairman, committee and members and Grand Superintendents in April as easy and painless as possible.
- 2) This committee has decided that there is no longer any need for applications to be sent to Grand Chapter or the Grand Scribe Ezra for his inspection. Immediately following this 2008 convocation it is asked that all applications be sent directly to the Grand Chapter Scholarship & Bursary Chairman. This decision is considered as another step in streamlining our process and will save time and unnecessary postage.
- 3) The application form has been changed slightly in order to make it a bit more user friendly for both the applicant and sponsor as well as more efficient for this committee.
- 4) This committee has once again decided that only students who are continuing their education within the Province of Ontario shall be entitled to receive funding from this committee. It is felt that this decision would enable us to continue with the established and approved bursary qualifications.
- 5) Elimination of the \$250.00 bursary award for the first year immediately following High School. This was a suggested change that was not approved this year but is to be passed on

to the next committee for future consideration. The main intent of this idea would be as a cost cutting and student dedication measure. As we came close but did not surpass our budget this year it was our decision to leave this elimination consideration for future committees once their budgets are determined.

None of these new changes were taken lightly and a lot of consideration has gone into our decisions. The changes that we made are meant to enable us to effectively manage our set budgets and to better comply the Provincial Government regulations.

Once again packages containing new application forms & guidelines for bursary grants have been prepared for the new Grand Superintendents and for distribution to his District Chairman.

In conclusion I would like to thank the council for allowing me to chair this committee over the past couple of years. Thank you to all those who have made donations to the Scholarship & Bursary Fund. Your generous donations will allow us to continue to make a difference.

Thank you to my committee members both past and present. Your efforts and dedication have allowed this committee to assist and impress the generosity and fine qualities of Masonry upon the minds of hundreds of students.

We rest assured that our work this past year has helped to make a difference in the lives and education of the students we have assisted. We consider the money awarded to these worthy students an investment towards **OUR FUTURE**.

Finally, we the committee would like to congratulate this Grand Chapter on its 150th anniversary and hope our efforts will help to keep this Grand Chapter strong for another 150 years.

REPORT OF THE FRATERNAL CORRESPONDENCE COMMITTEE

To the Most Excellent the Grand First Principal, Officers and Members of The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

Most Excellent Sir and Companions:

This year I have had the pleasure of receiving and reviewing the Annual Proceedings of 14 jurisdictions from Canada, the United States, Ireland, England, Scotland and Greece. Nine of these were made available on computer discs and this trend is expected to continue because of the high printing costs. The drop in the number of returns is regrettable and in the next year, this committee should try to re-establish our contacts.

Again, all jurisdictions report declining membership, albeit significantly reduced from previous years. Suspensions for non-payment of dues seems to be at an all-time low and

demits are also lower. Death, however appear to be on the rise because of the high average age of the members.

Chapter amalgamations and closures continue at somewhat lower rates than the past several years. To counter this trend, a few jurisdictions have adopted "six-member openings" and a reduction to four meetings per year. This would allow the smaller chapters to continue in active status.

There are reports of very successful recruitment drives, e.g., field days and established reward targets. Through these means, some chapters are again reporting increases to their membership rolls.

Further optimism is being expressed by reports of increasing membership in Craft Lodges. To take advantage of this trend, England is considering the establishment of a Royal Arch representative in each lodge as well as possibly even a Lodge Officer who would be responsible for promoting the Order to Master Masons.

All jurisdictions are very active in the development and introduction of training materials and programs for chapter use. Schools of instruction, officer development, guidelines for creative meetings, and award programs for recruiters are some areas being pursued. To facilitate member retention, guidelines for more interesting meetings and the meaningful participation of members are being undertaken; the object being to challenge the companion and to encourage continued participation.

Yes, there is a glimmer of hope but there is also a realization that there is no simple answer or panacea to deal with our issues. Much hard work is necessary, using all the aids at our disposal and these have increased significantly. In the final analysis, creative and dedicated officers and every companion must work together to make a difference.

I would like to thank you, Most Excellent Sir, for the opportunity to serve this, our Grand Chapter.

REPORT OF THE INVESTMENTS COMMITTEE

To the Most Excellent the Grand First Principal, Officers and Members of The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

Most Excellent Sir and Companions:

It has been a difficult year for investment funds, in general however, your Investment Committee is pleased to report that our investment portfolio has held it's own admirably. Your committee monitors the management of our three portfolios; the General Account, which includes the Victory Thanksgiving Benevolence Fund, the Scholarship and Bursary Account and the Medical Research account.

Under the overall guidance of the investment policy approved by this Grand Executive, our investment advisors, RBC Dominion Securities have performed very well for our portfolio. Our very talented investment advisor and his staff are very familiar with our requirements, having been retained as the investment manager of other Masonic bodies with sizeable portfolios and similar investment objectives as our Grand Chapter.

Our Policy Statement includes guidelines for the asset mix of our investment portfolio which calls for the various components [cash, short term investments, fixed income instruments and equity investments] to fall within set proportions of the entire portfolio. We strive to maximize long-term capital and income growth consistent with low-to-moderate risk. It also has to produce an income stream to cover some operating expenses, as well as the funds necessary to sustain the medical research and bursary programs of the Grand Chapter Charities.

We are very pleased to report that our investment advisor has performed well within the policy guidelines, even facing this difficult market. Your Investment Committee is in regular contact with the advisor and his staff and receives regular detailed reports on the portfolio and all transactions.

Each of our investment portfolios continues to grow within the defined risk profile and earns a rate of return in excess of the objectives.

The average rate of return on our investments for the fiscal year ended February 29, 2008, continued to beat the market, at about 7.2% [actually better than the previous year of about 5.8%]. However, the market value of our investments dropped by about 1.9% compared to an increase of about 1.5% last year.

The market value of our total portfolio is just under \$2,000,000. Having increased by about \$65,000 over the previous year. The increase is made up of approximately \$135,000 investment return, \$35,000 decrease in market value, \$15,000 withdrawn from the General Investment Fund, and \$20,000 withdrawn from the Scholarship and Bursary Fund. These withdrawals however, are well under the investment return of these funds.

The Executive Committee has approved the Investment Committee's recommendation that Grand Chapter continue to retain the services of our current Investment Fund Committee, RBC Dominion Securities, downtown Hamilton branch and our current advisor, Mr. Richard te Boekhorst.

Finally, on behalf of the other members of the Investment Committee, M.Ex.Comp. Richard J Jackson and R.Ex.Comp. Shavak R Madon, we are pleased to have had this opportunity to serve our Grand Chapter.

REPORT OF THE GRAND TREASURER

To the Most Excellent the Grand First Principal, officers and members of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

Most Excellent Sir and Companions:

It is my privilege to present to you the financial statements of the Grand Chapter, the Medical Research Fund and the Scholarship and Bursary Funds for the year ended February 28, 2008.

The following are the highlights for the fiscal year 2008.

The Grand Chapter: The total revenue was \$120,800 compared to \$128,200 in 2007. Our expenses amounted to \$110,200 as against \$109,600 in the prior year. We ended the year excess of revenue over expenses of \$10,600 compared to \$18,600 in the prior year.

Over the past three years for our 150th Anniversary celebration, we have collected \$18,600 which includes miscellaneous donations and sale of merchandise. Todate we have paid and accrued for expenses of \$20,900 and as a result the balance of \$2,300 is reflected on the balance sheet.

The Scholarship and Bursary Fund: The total revenue was \$41,600 compared to \$42,600 in the prior year. We paid out bursaries of \$20,600 compared to \$30,900 in 2007. We ended the year with a surplus of \$19,400 compared to \$10,000 in the prior year.

The Medical Research Fund: The total revenue was \$59,700 compared to \$134,900 in 2007. During the year we made grants of \$20,000 as against \$20,000 in the prior year. We ended the year with a surplus of \$38,000 compared to \$112,200 in the prior year. We were very fortunate to receive several substantial bequests in prior year and as a result, our donations amounted to \$24,100 compared to \$102,200 in 2007.

Investments: Under the new CICA pronouncements for Financial Instruments, all investments have to be reported at market value instead of cost. This change is to be done prospectively with no change to prior year figures. As a result, the investment figures for the three organizations were adjusted upwards by \$222,700 as of March 1st, 2007. The market value of our total investments at the Grand Chapter, the Scholarship & Bursary Fund and the Medical Research Fund amounted to \$1,958.800 compared to \$1,825,500 in prior year.

General: As in prior years, I met several times with the Grand Scribe Ezra and the Grand Council to discuss the financial affairs of Grand Chapter. I sincerely appreciate the efforts of our Grand Council and Grand Scribe Ezra to stringently control the finances of the Grand Chapter and the two related funds. I would like to thank the Grand Scribe Ezra for the fullest cooperation provided to me throughout the year.

Finally, I would like to acknowledge the efforts and dedication of the Finance Committee and Investments Committee members.

In our opinion, except for the omission of the disclosure described in the preceding paragraph, and except for the effect of adjustments, if any which we night have determined to be necessary had we been able to satisfy ourselves concerning the completeness of revenues referred to above, these financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the organization as at February 28, 2008 and the results of its operation for the year then ended, in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles.

The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario Scholarship and Bursary Fund is a registered charity in Ontario, and is exempt from income tax under the Income Tax Act.

The object of the organization is to provide assistance in the form of bursaries to Royal Arch Masons' dependants of members, windows and orphans of members to complete their education at universities, community or technical colleges.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Investments

All investments are classified as held-for-trading. These investments are measured at fair value with gains and losses recognized in net income. Any unrealized holding gains and losses related to held-for-trading investments are included in net income. The quoted market price was used to estimate the fair value of the financial instruments held as investments.

3. CHANGE IN ACCOUNTING POLICY

The Organization has adopted the provisions of CICA Handbook Section 3855, Financial Instruments - Recognition and Measurement and Section 4400, Financial Statement Presentation by Not-for-Profit Organizations (in place of those in section 1530) which address the classification, recognition and measurement of financial instruments in the financial statements and the inclusion of unrealized investment holding income (gains, losses, interest and dividends). As a result of adopting these new standards, the Organization has recorded a non-cash charge of \$80,916 for the change in accounting for financial assets classified as held-for-trading and measured at fair value instead of cost. This charge is reported as a one-time cumulative effect of a change in accounting policy in opening accumulated net assets on March 1, 2007.

4. INVESTMENTS

The current year investments are reported at fair market value, the actual book value (cost base) is \$634,787 (2007 - \$609,810). The comparative figures have not been restated to reflect the new auditing standards in accordance with the transitional provisions for CICA Handbook Section 3855. As a result, the comparative figures are stated at cost while the current figures are stated at market value. As well, accrued interest receivable for the current year is included in the fair value of the investments.

5. RESTRICTED NET ASSETS

The net assets restricted for scholarships and bursaries are externally restricted for purpose of providing educational assistance. These amounts are not available for other purposes without the approval of the membership.

6. INVESTMENT INCOME

Investment income consists of realized capital gains on the sale of investments, realized interest and dividend income and unrealized investment gains and losses.

7. FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The financial statements of the organization include cash, receivables, payables and portfolio investments. The fair values of cash, receivables and payables are assumed to approximate their carrying amounts because of their short term to maturity. The fair value of investments are assumed to approximate quoted market value.

Portfolio investments are placed in well capitalized, high quality corporate and government securities. The organization does not use derivative instruments to reduce its exposure to interest and foreign currency risk. The organization has no significant concentrations of credit

The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario Medical Research Fund (Release a Miracle Fund) is a registered charity in Ontario, and is exempt from income tax under the Income Tax Act.

The object of the organization is to provide funds for medical research upon receiving a valid request for assistance.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNT POLICIES

Investments

All investments are classified as held-for-trading. These investments are measured at fair value with gains and losses recognized in net income. Any unrealized holding gains and losses related to held-for-trading investments are included in net income. The quote market price was used to estimate the fair value of the financial instruments held as investments.

3. CHANGE IN ACCOUNTING POLICY

The Organization has adopted the provisions of CICA Handbook Section 3855, Financial Instruments - Recognition and Measurement and Section 4400, Financial Statement Presentation by Not-for-Profit Organizations (in place of those in section 1530) which address the classification, recognition and measurement of financial instruments in the financial statements and the inclusion of unrealized investment holding income (gains, losses, interest and dividends). As a result of adopting these new standards, the Organization has recorded a non-cash charge of \$80,916 for the change in accounting for financial assets classified as held-for-trading and measured at fair value instead of cost. This charge is reported as a one-time cumulative effect of a change in accounting policy in opening accumulated net assets on March 1, 2007.

As a result, the comparative figures are stated at cost while the current figures are stated at market value. As well, accrued interest receivable for the current year is included in the fair value of the investments.

5. RESTRICTED NET ASSETS

The net assets restricted for scholarships and bursaries are externally restricted for purpose of

providing educational assistance. These amounts are not available for other purposes without the approval of the membership.

6. INVESTMENT INCOME

REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

To the Most Excellent the Grand First Principal and Members of The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

Most Excellent Sir and Companions:

Once again no recognition has been given to any gain or loss on sale of investments in the actual or budgeted figures in this report. This will of course be recognized in the audited financial statements.

Our actual revenue for 2008 came to \$102,900 compared to the budget of \$105,200. Our expenses were \$108,800 against a budget of \$118,800. As a result we have a deficit of \$5,900 (before recognizing capital gains of \$16,400) which compares with a budgeted deficit of \$13,600.

For the fiscal year ending February 2009 we are projecting a budgeted income of \$103,500 compared to budgeted expenses of \$115,700 resulting in a budgeted deficit of \$12,200. Our increase in expenses are particularly in the areas of office expenses and annual convocation. Our revenue base keeps going down due to a drop in membership and as a result our projected per-capita dues are \$2,400 lower than the actual for 2008. We are of course hoping that the actual results for the year will reflect a smaller deficit, or better still a surplus.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE MEDICAL RESEARCH FUND RELEASE A MIRACLE

To the Most Excellent, The Grand First Principal, Officers and Members of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

Most Excellent Sir and Companions:

This year end report covers the activities of the Committee on Medical Research of The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario for the year ending February 2008.

During the summer months of 2007, correspondence was sent to all Grand Superintendents to congratulate them on their preferment and encouraging them to promote the Grand Chapter Charities, especially "Release-a-Miracle" and to encourage the Companions in their Districts to continue with projects in raising of funds for this extremely important commitment that has been made by the Royal Arch Masons within our Jurisdiction.

The brochure was amended, updated and distributed to the Districts through the Grand Superintendents highlighting the History, how funds are raised and its objectives together with general information on the programs that have been supported.

Over the past twenty-five years an amount in excess of seven hundred & sixty thousand (\$760,000) dollars has been donated to Medical Research projects. The projects that have been selected and continued this year, to ensure that our donations are concentrated and made the best use of are: Autism, Prostate Cancer, Arthritis and Alzheimers.

I would respectfully report that the following projects have been given our support for 2008:

- a) Dr. Jeanette J.A. Holden, Director, Autistic Spectrum Disorders, Queen's \$5,000.00
 - University for research into the genetics and epidemiology.
- b) Dr. Neil Fleshner, Head Division of Urology, University Health Network \$5,000.00
 - for investigations into the relationship of dietary factors to prostate cancer.
- Dr. Edward Keystone, Director, Centre for Advanced Therapeutics \$5,000.00
 in Arthritis AARC Foundation, University Health Network conducting research on new treatment modalities.
- d) Professor Peter St. George Hyslop, Director, Centre for Neurodegenerati \$5,000.00 diseases University of Toronto. Advance studies of gene effects of Alzheimers.

This year has seen the \$1,000,000.00 (Million Dollar Club) project well under way. Todate the donations have passed twenty-three thousand dollars (\$23,000.00) The companions, in return for a donation of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) will receive a special lapel pin and certificate enrolling him into the Club with 95% of the donation going to the Release-A-Miracle Fund. The goal is to have the capital of the fund reach a Million Dollars, which would ensure that the fund will continue to be a self sustaining contributor to our selected Research Projects.

We are still a long way from achieving the \$1,000,000.00 of capital investment. However, the

committee along with the current and incoming Grand Superintendents will strive to keep this project in the forefront of the District events. As we celebrate this year of our One Hundred and Fifty years of Royal Arch Masonry the committee would urge all districts to continue to be supportive of the Million Dollar Club project and strive to reach that magical figure of One Million Dollars of Capital Investment which would continue to enable us in contributing generous donations to respective Medical Research programs.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE CONDITION OF CAPITULAR MASONRY

To the Most Excellent the Grand First Principal, Officers and Members of The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

Most Excellent Sir and Companions:

This report is submitted on behalf of the 15 District Grand Superintendents.

The final reports from the Grand Superintendents were well completed and described the state of Royal Arch Masonry in each District in Ontario. Many topics were noted, however there is not sufficient time to really expand on every topic. Here is a short summary of the topics.

Official Visits: The interim and final reports from the Grand Superintendents were well done and reflected the state of Royal Arch Masonry in each District in Ontario. Many topics were discussed at the final meeting but there is not sufficient time here to really expand on every topic. The Official Visits reports were received generally on time. Proper protocol at official visits was observed for all receptions. The quality of work varied from excellent to officers reading from the ritual book. Proper instruction and rehearsal for degrees are important to impress the candidate and should be made mandatory.

Course of Instruction: Courses of Instruction were completed in all Districts. Attendance was generally good. The Grand Superintendents are to be congratulated on developing and delivering interesting courses with varying agendas and information. It is hoped that the content of the courses will be collated into a presentation and made available to the new Grand Superintendents.

Membership: The summonses indicated that many chapters had at least one candidate to advance. Furthermore, there were a number of Chapters who advanced multiple candidates, with a small number of Chapters advancing more than 4. Let us hope that we can keep the new candidates busy and interested. Although this influx of candidates augers well for the future of Royal Arch Masonry we must also consider demits, deaths, and amalgamations. It is recommended that new members are not forced into office chairs too quickly. Declining membership continues to be a problem in all the masonic bodies and Royal Arch Masonry is no exception. This problem leads to financial and leadership difficulties arising from time to

time particularly in weaker chapters. A struggling chapter does not attract new members. Officers need to be motivated and show some enthusiasm and leadership to have a successful chapter. Many of the companions recognize this, but need time to work on solutions. We need to maintain and support the older members in the role of mentors and advisors and prevent them from fading away, particularly those in ill health.

Communications: We all realize that the interest of companions is taken up in family events, work and other domestic activities. We therefore have to portray in the summons that a Royal Arch meeting is worth the effort to attend. Summonses are the main media through which we can become involved in the Chapter. Each companion is entitled to get a summons to learn what is occurring in his District and Grand Chapter. The summons should therefore be appealing, eye-catching, have relevant information and delivered on time. It is difficult to find out what is happening in the chapter if the summonses are not properly structured and have little content.

The committee on e-mail use will be presenting their report to Grand Chapter at this convocation and we look forward to its recommendations. The web site should be expanded and made more accessible to companions.

The Royal Arch display was present at a number of public relation events. The mini displays are proving useful in master mason nights and open houses. I thank the Grand Superintendents and their Secretaries for the massive amount of work performed in the Districts. They have to travel far distances, make speeches, invest companions, distribute bursaries, and do many related ancillary actions in representing this Grand Chapter in the Province of Ontario. We wish them good luck and we look forward to meeting with them as they progress in York Rite masonry.

Our large display has only been used four times this year, starting off with a Master Masons night in Bowmanville, then the Poultry Fest in Smithville. The inquiries from the General Public tended to want to know more about what charities the different Masonic orders funded. This in mind we should have ample pamphlets not only telling about the Royal Arch but also explaining our charities. The two big events for the display and public relations were Grand Lodge in July at Toronto and The International Ploughing Match in September in Crosby. It has been a trend over that past several years to find that fewer Past Principals are being nominated to the various Grand Chapter Offices and unfortunately, again this year, the Committee found no choice but to reject several nominations due to Constitutional practices not being observed. Read the Constitution and do not assume anything. Limited Chapter recommendations for Grand Chapter appointments of worthy Past Principals is leaving positions vacant. This presents a difficult task for the Grand Council to hunt for individuals to fill these Offices. This is an invitation for each Chapter to exercise input into your Grand Chapter by your choice of appointments.

The Distinguished Service Award does not get the attention we expect it to receive. There are many Companions who have no interest in advancing through the Principal chairs but make regular contributions to the work within the Chapter. To each Chapter, examine your membership for these Companions and submit the proper recommendation designed for that purpose.

"The Good Old Days?", that's history but today we are moving into the fast, modern world of technology which keeps everyone scrambling to keep up. To encourage participation, two Ad Hoc Committees have been developed to find better ways of doing business and plan for the future.

First, a Computer Resources Committee, chaired by R.Ex.Comp. Paraag Suchak, with the power to add is mandated to look into Office Computer programs, availability of communication forms on the web site and complete the electronic mailing of the Chapter Summons. The members of this Committee bring years of experience in this field and a positive direction is expected.

Second, a Long Range Planning Committee chaired by R.Ex.Comp. Robert McMaster has been formed to look into the future of the structure of Capitular Masonry in this jurisdiction. The Committee members have been selected from all parts of the Province with the option to add as required and they will gather facts and analyze information on priority topics and recommend action to the Grand Executive for consideration. How many times has it been said that Masonry moves slow, but the importance of steady steps builds a sound road of progress.

The focus of Royal Arch Charities has been aimed at Medical Research over the past 4 years and although below target, positive results have occurred. However, students of today are feeling the financial burden of high tuition fees and expensive books and for this reason I recommend the Scholarship and Bursary Fund receive more attention since the pay out has been considerably higher than total contributions to the Fund over the past several years. Keep the little envelope for Royal Arch Charities handy and use these for Memorial Contributions free from telemarketing lists. Remember our future leaders of Canadian economy and support the Scholarship and Bursary Fund to help a student.

Communication tools are important to keep all Companions informed of jurisdiction wide activities. As a result, the Soap Box will be sent to each Chapter and posted on the Grand Chapter Web Site as a tool to distribute information. Guidelines have been adopted to reduce the repetitive information.

In an effort to maintain assistance to Chapters experiencing difficulties and return to positive activities, the following Chapters will have their trustees reappointed; Minnewawa Chapter No 78., R. Ex. Comp. John Howden; Northern Lights Chapter No 213, R.Ex.Comp. Gordon McEwan; Tillsonburg Chapter No 255., V.Ex.Comp. Jon Bowman.

The following Chapters are in the process of exploring Amalgamation, Ancient Frontenac and Cataraqui Chapter No 1 Kingston and Mt. Sinai Chapter No 44 Napanee with R.Ex.Comp. Needham Throop reappointed as a representative chairman. There is never a rush to complete this process but it is more important to be thorough and accurate in the design of an agreement for the future success of Royal Arch Masonry.

The amalgamation process of Golden Chapter No 90 and Alberton Chapter No 152 is now complete and appreciation goes to R.Ex.Comp. Wayne Therrien for his contribution in maintaining a positive process. The ceremony is scheduled for April 23, 2008 at 8:00PM in Kenora at Golden Chapter No 90. A good visitation would express your support to this amalgamated Chapter and I have made arrangements to be present and conduct the ceremony.




