Street, 1866; includes purchase by Street at auction west half of lot no. 23, second concession, in the township of Dawn, Lambton County, 100 acres.</p>		
<b>Physical Description / Condition:</b>	<p>2 land documents in good condition.</p> <p>Papers include two land documents recording the purchase by auction of two parcels of land in Dawn Township, Lambton County in 1862 and 1866.</p>		
<b>Administrative/ Biographical Sketch</b>	<p>Thomas Clark Street was the son of Abigail (Ransome) and Samuel Street, a loyalist and mill owner in the Niagara area. In 1838 Thomas Clark Street was called to the bar after extensive studies in Toronto. He returned to Chippawa, Ont. to manage his extensive land holdings and investments. He was elected to the Legislative Assembly in 1851, was defeated in 1854 and elected again in 1861, representing the constituents of Welland County until his death in 1872. Street was a director of the Niagara Falls Suspension Bridge Company, president of the Gore Bank and director of the Bank of Upper Canada, as well as other banks and companies. Thomas Clark Street died in 1872 unmarried with an estate estimated between 3 and 4 million.</p>
