Dr Jane

Agreeable to the conclusion

that You and Mary and Colouel[?] came to Yesterday
of meeting here tomorrow to endeavor to
Settle that old unfortunate business I shall
expect you without fail not with [?]

since you have made the attempt should

and shall not again interfere myself
until you three try it_ probably when
you get together things may terminate
differently from what you expect_

I was sorry not being at home
myself_ I send the Col's Letter to me
of Yesterday which you will be good enough
to bring with you in the Morning _ Mary
is I believe very much for a settlement
though she appears to have a strong impres-
-sion against me consequently very little
conversation ensues between us on the subject
