Summary of Contents:	<p>A letter by Dr. Zacheus Bartlett to his nephew Freeman Nye, Champlain, New York, August 1, 1813. The letter comments on the war of 1812. Bartlett states that <i>“this disgraceful and wanton war already has carried distress to the cradles and firesides of us—upon the borders of the Atlantic—God grant a speedy end to the authority of its weak or wicked authors’... a kind providence...cloths our fields with full crops, but a deep gloom over shadows every face, once the abode of cheerfulness...”</i></p>

Administrative/ Biographical Sketch:	Zacheus Bartlett (1765-1835) was a doctor in Plymouth, Massachusetts. He was an early adopter of the process of vaccination, following Dr. Benjamin Waterhouse’s lead.
