<b>Administrative/ Biographical Sketch:</b>	Fort Oswego was an 18 <sup>th</sup> century trading post located where Lake Ontario meets the Oswego River in New York. It was originally established in 1727 by the British. In 1756 French and Native American forces captured the fort and destroyed it. Fort Ontario was built near the site and is preserved as an historic site.
