Col.William Chewett (1753-1849) was a surveyor, office holder, Justice of the Peace and militia officer. During the War of 1812 he commanded the 3rd Regiment York Militia and assisted Maj.-Gen. Isaac Brock by acting as a draftsman in both Niagara and Detroit. He also helped to negotiate the terms of surrender with the American forces in April 1813 after British forces retreated from York.
