<b>Administrative/ Biographical Sketch</b>	<p>Augustus Louis Jukes was born in India in 1821 and came to Canada in 1833. He worked on the second Welland Canal and became assistant engineer in charge of the Deep Cut between Thorold and Port Robinson. He entered the field of medicine, graduating with honors from Kings College Medical School, Toronto in 1847. Augustus Jukes, son of Andrew Jukes and Augusta Hole married Phebe Maria Adams, daughter of Elias Smith Adams &amp; Susan Merritt on June 7, 1848 at St. George's Church, St. Catharines, Ont. He practiced in Port Robinson until 1859 when he moved to St. Catharines. In 1882 he was appointed Senior Medical Officer for the North West Mounted Police (NWMP) and accompanied 220 men to Fort Walsh in Saskatchewan. He moved to Regina, Sask. in 1885. During the imprisonment of Louis Riel he saw him frequently and was present at his trial and execution. He left the NWMP in 1893 and died in Vancouver, B.C. in 1905.</p>
