Administrative/ Biographical Sketch	<p>On 12 April 1790, John Stevens and Adam Hutt agreed to divide their lands to their mutual benefit. The agreement lays out the manner in which this will be accomplished. The land, lots one and two in the eighth concession, was in Township No. 2, Nassau County, Province of Quebec, prior to the division into Upper and Lower Canada in 1791. After the arrival of John Graves Simcoe, Township No. 2 became Stamford Township, today it is part of the city of Niagara Falls, Ont. Witnesses to the signing were William Kenworthy and William Stevens.</p> <p>John Stevens, a Butler's Ranger, joined the Indian Department in 1777 and was part of Capt. Ten Broeck's company from 1782-1783. He settled between Four Mile Creek and the Head of Lake Ontario in 1785. By 1786 he is listed as having a wife and four children, his total land grant was 400 acres.</p> <p>Adam Hutt (1762-1842) was of German descent, and married to Dorothea Ball. The couple immigrated to Upper Canada some time after the Revolutionary War. In the agreement Adam Hutt signs his name as Adam Hodt. Adam and Dorthea Hutt was both buried in the Hutt family cemetery in Niagara Falls, Ont.</p>
