Administrative/ Biographical Sketch	<p>Catharine Young (1773-1840) was the wife of John Young, a merchant living in the town of Niagara, Province of Upper Canada. The printed will outlines her bequests. Family members and others included in the bequests are: Niece Mary Catharine Sumner, wife of Vernal Sumner, deceased, of the town of Niagara; Catharine Mary Sumner, daughter of Mary Catharine and Vernal Sumner; John Fulton, town of Niagara; sister Mary Crooks, wife of Francis Crooks, of the township of Grimsby; niece Eliza Ann Gatfield, wife of Alfred M. Gatfield, township of Grimsby; niece Margaret Helen Crooks, daughter of Francis and Mary Crooks; nephew Charles James Crooks, son of Francis and Mary Crooks; St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, town of Niagara; Hezekiah H. Smith, village of Youngstown, New York, USA; brother Jacob Stagg. Executors are: John Fulton, town of Niagara; brother Richard Stagg, Bergen County, New Jersey, USA; nephew Francis Stagg, son of Jacob Stagg, Paterson, New Jersey, USA Witnesses to the signing of the will were: William T. Cameron, William H. Dee and William Duff Miller. Two codicils were added later the same year to the existing will.</p>
