Administrative/ Biographical Sketch	<p>The Oban Inn in Niagara-on-the-Lake, Ontario started out as the home of Captain Duncan Milloy, a sailor from Oban, Scotland. He built his home on the corner of Front and Gate Street in 1824 for his wife and three children, William, Colin and Effie. Captain Milloy operated the steamboat City of Toronto III which travelled between Toronto and Niagara-on-the-Lake. Son William Milloy took over the home and ran it as a boarding house until his death. It is at this time that the house became known as the Oban Inn, named after Capt. Milloy's birthplace. After the death of William Milloy the inn passed to his sister Effie and her husband Arthur Harvey. The brochure indicates that the proprietors are Mr. and Mrs. Bernard Ricci.</p>
