<b>Administrative/ Biographical Sketch</b>	<p>Tuttle, Date and Rodden were manufacturers and dealers in agricultural implements and edge tools in St. Catharines, Ont. at the Welland Vale Works. Officers of the company were E.C. [Eben Clark] Tuttle, 1806-1873, originally from Connecticut; H.H. [Henry H.] Date, William Henry Rodden of Toronto and E. C. Tuttle's son, A.C. [Adlelbert C.] Tuttle (married to Mary [Margaret] E. Struthers Carlisle in St. Catharines in 1872). Prior to setting up shop in St. Catharines, E.C. Tuttle had operated factories in Union City, Connecticut and Oshawa, Ont. Tuttle and Rodden were both inventors and improvers of agricultural implements. The firm of Tuttle, Date and Rodden ceased operation about 1873. The manufacturing of agricultural and edge tools was soon taken over by W.D. Chaplin and renamed Welland Vale Manufacturing. E.C. Tuttle was married to Temperance Beecher (d. 1863) and then to Charlotte Bentz.</p>
